

"Redeemed, How I Love To Proclaim It"

Those who are bereaved often have haunting questions and doubts. An approach to the answers must be done with care and concern. It is a difficult assignment because the answers must not contain judgments which are beyond mankind's knowledge. Our knowledge is limited. Christianity is not driven by emotions, but rather by faith (Rom 10:16, 17; Heb 11:1-6). Anguish often causes emotions, complex feelings which cloud understanding and truth. Viewpoints among believers may vary greatly. It will be needful to establish a foundation upon which these circumstances can be examined and handled. The most consistent knowledge we have is "...inasmuch as it is appointed unto men once to die and after this cometh judgment" (Heb 9:27). It must be affirmed that we will all appear before the judgment seat of Christ (2 Cor 5:10). The deeds in the body are precursors to our standing with the redeemed.

Does a person survive the body? When an instrument of science is smashed it is not equivalent to killing the person who is seeking knowledge through that instrument. Killing the talented scientist is not equivalent to stopping research. The body is the expression of our personality. It is the instrument which we use to transmit our self. The body is not totally us. It is only a part. It is a shell which will one day be shuffled off (1 Cor 15:50-58; 2 Cor 5:1-10). In the course of years the body will change. The inner and outer body dies and is replaced every seven years. Therefore the body is but the temple of the soul (1 Cor 3:16-19; 6:18-20). Personality, personhood, soul and spirit survive the changes of the body. Man is not totally a physical creature. He can be examined and value given to the chemicals making up the body but they are not the total of mankind. The whole story is not the body. There is the mind, will, conscience, memory and the inner man (2 Cor 4:1-8). These are unexplainable and no value can be set upon them. It is obvious that an individual can judge itself, guide its choices, shape its conduct and look at itself in an objective and subjective manner. Life is more than our bodies.

God made mankind to hunger and thirst. He supplied the means to satisfy these needs. Man needs air, God provided. Whatever need man

has a corresponding fulfillment has been found. God providentially provided all for man's wants and needs. Mankind yearns to know the future life beyond the vessel of flesh. This is not man's making. God has provided a reality for the desire of immortality (1 Cor 15:50-58). Job's question was "...if a man dies will he live again?" (Job 14:14). The answer is found in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ (Rom 1:1-11: 6:1-11). God demonstrated the need to live for eternal things and that death is not an annihilation, but rather a passing into a spiritual realm (Lk 16:19-31). Abraham was alive according to Jesus. Lazarus went to be with Abraham. Hence, there is a place for those who live after death. God is not the God of the dead but of the living (Mat 22:23-33). Jesus proclaimed that Abraham, Isaac and Jacob were alive. Jesus assured His disciples he was going to where the Father was (Jn 14:1-5). He prayed for the faithful that they might be in "glory" with Him (Jn 17). God is dependable and just and has placed in our hearts "eternity" (Eccl 3:11). He would not have awakened us to eternity if there was not an eternity. The taking of Enoch, who walked with God, would have no purpose if there was not an eternity for him to be carried to (Gen 5:21-24). Elijah, taken up into heaven, was vouchsafed by Elisha (2 Kg 2:1-14). Elijah appeared to the Lord with Moses (Mat 17:1-5). Moses was alive after death. It was God who had buried him (Deut 34:5, 6). Repeatedly God proved that there is a home of the soul after death.

Things which mortal man's eyes have not seen are affirmed by two who were privileged to see the world beyond. Paul heard unspeakable words, saw the splendor of the world beyond (2 Cor 12:1-10). John was given a heavenly vision of the "city four square" (Rev 21:16). The promise of Jesus returning in the clouds to call the dead in Him to arise and meet Him in the air is filled with comfort (1 Thes 4:12-18). At the ascension of Jesus, to the right hand of the Father, those in "white apparel" said, "Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was received up from you into heaven shall so come in like manner as ye beheld him going into heaven" (Acts 1:12). Men and angels proclaim life after death (Gal 1:6-10).

The church exists because of Jesus' life, death, resurrection and ascension. She began with the assurance that God through His determinate council and foreknowledge would raise Jesus from the dead. God had sworn with an oath to David that Christ would be resurrected. Jesus was resurrected to become Lord and Redeemer (Acts 2:17-47). The Christian martyr, Stephen, saw Jesus Christ standing at the right hand of God (Acts 7:54-60). The overwhelming Bible teaching is that the redeemed live beyond the grave.

"Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good. In love of the brethren be tenderly affectioned one to another; in honor preferring one another; in diligence not slothful; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord; rejoicing in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing steadfastly in prayer; communicating to the necessities of the saints; given to hospitality. Bless them that persecute you; bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that rejoice; weep with them that weep. Be of the same mind one toward another. Set not your mind on high things, but condescend to things that are lowly. Be not wise in your own conceits. Render to no man evil for evil. Take thought for things honorable in the sight of all men. If it be possible, as much as in you lieth, be at peace with all men. Avenge not yourselves, beloved, but give place unto the wrath of God: for it is written, Vengeance belongeth unto me; I will recompense, saith the Lord. But if thine enemy hunger, feed him; if he thirst, give him to drink: for in so doing thou shalt heap coals of fire upon his head. Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good" (Romans 12:9-21).

Righteous Acts

Righteous and good acts are ideals found in the beatitudes (Mat 5:1-12). The aim Jesus had for mankind at the end of life was to take up an abode in the home of the blessed. The beatitudes describe a variety of ways where the blessed can project, by living the righteous life of one who serves here and now, a hope of eternal life with God (Sermon on Mount). It is desired that a Christian live a life now that will convey them into the eternal. The reward of eternal life is open to those who precisely recognize that they cannot earn it and if obedience is possible it is only because God is a forgiving God (Rom 5:1-11; 2 Pet 3:8-15). The ethics of the gospel are requirements and possible when men and women determine to practice them diligently daily. To those who will not seek to maintain the righteousness of God, He will be far greater and more terrifying than anything found in the lake of fire (Heb 10:25-30). But for those who practice seeking the presence of God in this life the vision of God is a fitting and final conclusion to their journey.

There is little doubt that Jesus wanted exemplary morals and principles lived out among His followers. In justice and honor it is important to realize that the primary bulwark against assimilation of worldly practices into Christianity is to never **delegitimize** the Bible's teachings. In light of the concern for the glory of God, a child of God persistently seeks His will. The Lord had no reservations that there was an immediate danger for disciples if they stop learning and practicing His will.

Men and women must perform the ethical teachings of Jesus. His teachings are explicated [to make clear the meaning; explain] and implicated [to convey, imply, or suggest without directly expressing]. The highest standard of ethical observation cannot be enforced by law alone. Individuals must be willing to give their heart, soul and will to God which annuls unclean carnal desires (Col 3:5-8). All must not be overcome of evil but overcome evil with good. The redeemed mind must desire purity. Jesus' own example is a fitting means to understand how to conscientiously seek for the understanding and use of the commandments of God. Jesus' example is a guide that men and women can use for finding their way to a practical application of their obedience to God's plan. Such a dramatic shift in behavior is bound to bring a parting of the ways with those who have brought about an editing of God's will to make it more appealing to the sensual, carnal mind and agreeable with the world.

The world cannot be won to Christ by lessening the greatness of Christianity. Jesus turned the Pharisees on their head by telling the crowd to "beware of the leaven of the Pharisees". Their silent, pervasive spreading of change was unquestionably the behavior Jesus did not accept (Mk 11:15). Their actions were insidious pollutions, containing a form of contaminates like "vain of worship". "Instrumental music added to worship" today has become the same. To interpret the Bible wrongly is detrimental to understand God from whence it came. If the church breaks the holy will of God under the strain of "political correctness" then there is something seriously wrong. Ethics do not surrender to the enemies of holiness. There must be more determination than that. Jesus and His teachings fulfill, never worsen His followers. **Don Hatch**
