FAMILY CARE A Message from Our Shepherds

This article caught my eye this week and I wanted to share it with you. Our gospel meeting starts next Sunday. What are you going to do to help it be success? Pray about it and invite your friends, neighbors, and loved ones to hear the precious message of God's word!

TASTE THE SOUP!

Recently, Pa was being irritable, especially regarding food. At a nearby restaurant, he stopped for a quick meal and the waiter provided a bowl of soup. As the waiter turned away to return to the kitchen, Pa stopped him, calling: "Waiter!" "Yes, sir, is there something wrong?" "The soup. Taste it," replied Pa. "I beg your pardon, Sir?" "Taste it." "But, Sir, I can assure you that the soup is excellent." "Taste it," Pa persisted. "Sir, the soup was made this morning of the finest ingredients." "Taste it!" The exasperated waiter finally relented. "All right, Sir, I'll taste it." Then after a pause he said, "Where is the spoon?" To which Pa replied triumphantly, "Ah ha ..."

It doesn't matter how good soup is; if I have no way to get the soup to my mouth, I will never be able to enjoy it. In a similar way, it doesn't matter how wonderful the gospel message is, if it doesn't get to those who need it, it will never do them any good. The Bible uses several metaphors to describe this process. We are the "hands and feet" of Jesus. Also, Paul said in 2 Corinthians 4:7 that we are "earthen vessels" of little value that carry the far more valuable message about Jesus. Allow me to add one more image to the list -- we are God's "spoons"!

Think about this. Nobody eats a meal at a fine restaurant and then later raves about how nice the spoon was! No, they may rave about how good the soup was, but no one pays much attention to the spoon. The purpose of the spoon is merely to allow you to enjoy the soup. In fact, you hardly even notice the spoon....unless you don't have one! Our job is not to get people to notice us. Rather, our purpose is merely to get the gospel message to as many people as possible. "How then shall they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher?" (Romans 10:14). There are people around you who will never know the beauty of the story of Jesus Christ unless you're willing to be a "spoon"! Will you share that message with someone today?

Model Congregation - Don Hatch

"So the church throughout all Judaea and Galilee and Samaria had peace, being edified; and, walking in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, was multiplied" (Acts 9:31 ASV).

Historically congregations of the Lord's people have stood out as "scripturally sound models of the church of Christ". Others, for various reasons, have slipped into a state of less than "a model congregation of the church of Christ". Congregations constantly seeking for a new and exciting, more progressive posture are never filled with peace, edification, active participation by the masses, humility, happiness, holiness or a sense of wellbeing. Productions of new and hopefully exciting, progressive innovations demonstrate a constant flux in which these lives. A congregation should be excited about her work in faith, not her faith in works. The old paths are still the best and safest ones. The Lord's church has tasks of benevolence, edification, evangelization, stabilization of the new born in Christ and insuring the mature are feeding on the meat of the word of God (Act 9:31; Heb 5:11-14; Jas 1:27).

The first century church demonstrated the need for compliance to the apostolic doctrine in order that the saved had an overriding sense of peace. Acts 9:31 gives a glimpse into the Lord's body facing uncertain times with a certainty of who controls the days ahead. When harmony and relationships between brethren beget friendship, order and contentment, this ideal peace distinguishes a wholesomeness afforded only to those in Christ. Ambition, self-aggrandizement, lethal pride, devastating haughtiness and carnal actions are far removed from a peaceful congregation.

The congregation which spends time, energy and resources to edify the saints and warn the sinner will never be on the short end of the blessings from her Lord. Building each other up in the holy faith is a pledge of fidelity brought on by a distinctive relationship with God and His children. Consistency in the natural exercise of edification authenticates a renewal in faith which neither ebbs nor fails in any season.

Most activity levels of any congregation could be better, however an active congregation will be one where the willing are working and others are encouraged to be more active. The walk of faith in which efforts are directed towards service in the Master's cause is a compelling force. The concrete expression of vitality is not outrageous binges on certain efforts but daily being fruitful in righteousness.

Humility is the good sense to be respectful, pious, lowly and submissive to God. The humble have a different countenance and demeanor. It is a part of Christian living which cannot be faked. When the Bible says, "be sure your sins will find you out" it implies that humbling oneself under the mighty hand of God cannot be faked. Humility in a congregation is of inestimable value.

Contentment is the ability to feel sufficient. A congregation who knows God favors them because they are faithful presents to the world an air of beauty and fulfillment knowing that at the end of each life awaits the "well done thou good and faithful servant." Contentment knows the Lord is our defender and sustainer because of the actions which we take.

Multiplication is normal when a congregation models herself after first century principles. When God is glorified through the Son Jesus Christ, because of what the Holy Spirit provided as a master plan for a congregation, there will be a natural desire to see others favored with grace commonly enjoyed by Christians. The peaceful, edified, active, content and holy congregation will stand out as a beacon. We are highly favored here at Beltline Road Church of Christ and have much for which to be thankful!
