True Archeology Proves The Bible

Archeology is generally a science based upon the excavation, evaluating, deciphering cataloging of information from ancient sites, perennially filled with information about former civilizations. In a restricted sense the Bible has been a unique area wherein proof of its validity is of great importance. The Bible is unique in that it claims to be inerrant in all things. It does not purport to be a book of science, but is always proven accurate when it speaks of scientific things. There have been alleged discrepancies, but alleged is assumed only until proven. In comparison to all other books the Bible has been vindicated constantly in all areas. The critics have challenged its statements. All in the Bible has been or will eventually be vindicated. The supreme importance of the Bible and its historical statements by the ancients deepen faith in its teachings on spiritual requirements for those who seek to please God. Inevitably there are those posturing themselves as archaeologists who claim to have found something that shows the biblical claim false. They give false locations to where Moses led the children of Israel across the Red Sea, Mount Sinai, lost treasures of Solomon compounding their claims with dubious and doctored proofs. Archaeology is a field subject to many abuses by those with little formal training that have great imaginations. The "new atheism" is very militant and intolerant of religion and every remote value of a religious nature. They promote disbelief and are inflexible against God and those who have any form of belief in God or religion. Dewayne Bryant of Apologetics Press has written some great defense for Christians and demonstrates the fallacious statements of the "new atheists" [Armchair Archaeology and the New Atheism Vol. 31 #4]. The diatribes of the "new atheist" are numerous and bitter. They frequently write on subjects beyond their specialties as proof of their claims wherein their proficiency is inferior and demonstrate many mistakes in archaeology.

Archaeology is an exciting field and brings to light startling information. Scriptures by virtue of their character are a revelation from God to mankind wherein mankind's deepest needs are met. Hence, they are of paramount interest. Up to the nineteenth century very little was known about archaeological data except what appeared in the Bible or what was preserved in classical antiquities. Few nations left catalogs of information until late in the fifth century B.C. Consequently the Bible was the only book of

substance and value to which historians could turn. Before the advent of archaeology there was little available to illustrate the Bible. Many of the notable discoveries affected the Bible, particularly the Old Testament. The list of discoveries over the years is voluminous. The character of the Old Testament which has insured its preservation is that it communicated truth and expounded timely and much-needed information for the betterment of mankind.

Not long ago archaeologists agreed with the Bible on history, geography and cultural uniqueness. The most notable discoveries affecting the Bible were about the Old Testament. They found clear evidence giving background information to the text of the Bible. This is no longer the case. In the last quarter of a century those who are not archaeologists are intersecting with the Bible and writing stinging articles, doubting the veracity of the Bible and adopting radical narratives. The double standard used against the Bible is obvious and pervasive. Any mention of supernatural activities immediately disqualifies the Bible from being considered a reliable history by the new atheist. Other ancient works are filled with witchcraft, magic and fables which they judge as valid. Pseudoscholarship of the popular press attempts to diminish the faith of respectable Bible researchers. The Genesis creation, world-wide flood of Noah's day and countless other Bible accounts are made into fables saying that they are not scientifically testable. They regard science as incontestable. Using terms calculated to destroy faith, they make the Old and New Testaments into a body of mythology, false stories and valueless tidbits of information. They attack Jesus as a myth, created by the church to introduce their rites and rituals by a crucifixion account. They fail to realized the Bible was written in "real time" where each account could be investigated (Jn 20:30, 31; 1 Cor 15:1-10). They fail to consider those who became disciples were not wild fanatics, but rather sincerely devoted Jews, families with children, tradesmen, lawyers, doctors and the house of Caesar. Giving little evidence to substantiate their claims the new atheist has an audience which pants for their next book. Most of them do not have the basics of Christianity or religion upon which to build. They rage against theology not having the credentials to be critics.

The most notable discoveries of the past centuries have all authenticated the Bible. The character and history of the Bible has not been impeached, but rather vindicated. The types of investigation done by honest scholars are to analyze, study and discern without bias. The history of the Old Testament is intertwined with the New Testament. What proves one proves both. Redemptive history is distinctively wedded to prophecies which have been repeatedly proven true. The church has no fear of truth. She thrives on accuracy and validation. It is when men seek to skew the truth we raise a voice of concern. The Bible stands as a unique and true book from God.

ONLY THE CHURCH IS THE SAVED! What is the Church That Jesus Built? Christianity is the one true religion of the one true God, established by the one true Lord, Christ, and revealed by the one true Spirit in the one faith. Christianity expresses itself through literature, the Bible, the word of salvation; through a person, Jesus Christ, the savior; and through an institution, the church, the saved. The church then is the blood bought body of Christ. It is the saved (Acts2:47).

The Church is the spiritual body of Christ. "And he is the head of the body the church" (col. 1:18, Eph. 4:4). The church is the blood purchased people. "Take heed unto yourselves and to the flock, over which the Holy Spirit hath made you overseers, to feed the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood" (Acts 20:28). Therefore, the church is composed of those who have been purchased by the blood of Christ.

The church is the saved. "...For the husband is the head of the wife, as Christ is the head of the church, and he is the savior of the body" (Eph. 5:23). The church is the body of Christ (Eph1 :22,23). Therefore, Christ is the savior of the church. "And the Lord added to the church daily such as were being saved" (Acts 2:47). Those who are in the church constitute the saved; and those who are saved constitute the church. The Church is the house, household family of God, and the pillar and ground of truth (1 Tim. 3:15, Eph. 2:16-19, Eph. 3:14, 15). The church is the bride of Christ (Eph. 5:22, 23). The Lord's Flock

"And he said unto his disciples, Therefore I say unto you, Be not anxious for your life, what ye shall eat; nor yet for your body, what ye shall put on. For the life is more than the food, and the body than the raiment. Consider the ravens, that they sow not, neither reap; which have no store-chamber nor barn; and God feedeth them: of how much more value are ye than the birds! And which of you by being anxious can add a cubit unto the measure of his life? If then ye are not able to do even that which is least, why are ye anxious concerning the rest? Consider the lilies, how they grow: they toil not, neither do they spin; yet I say unto you, Even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. But if God doth so clothe the grass in the field, which to-day is, and to-morrow is cast into the oven; how much more shall he clothe you, O ye of little faith? And seek not ye what ye shall eat, and what ye shall drink, neither be ye of doubtful mind. For all these things do the nations of the world seek after: but your Father knoweth that ye have need of these things. Yet seek ye his kingdom, and these things shall be added unto you. Fear not, little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom..." (Lk 12:22-34).

Measuring success by size is commonplace in the world. It is a trendy thing to boast of largeness to prove worth. Real worth is the redemptive value of anything. The Bible explains redemptive value as "unsearchable riches" of redemption (Eph 3:8). The cornerstone of redemptive value is its spiritual importance. The Son of man came to seek and save the lost and give His life a ransom for many (Mk 10:45). The mission of the Messiah was redemption. His mission demonstrated redemptive value by the extraordinary cost (Isa 53).

The world tends to measure success of religion, business or individuals by the size. The most successful are those which are largest. It does not seem to dawn on them that the broad way leads to destruction and many enter there in (Mat 7:13, 14). The bulk of the religious world is compelled by grandeur, wealth, splendor, massiveness or quantity indexes without consideration of faithfulness to the scriptures (Mat 7:22, 23). The criteria must be what is done in the name of the Lord.

The encouragement Christ gave the disciples was that they were a "flock" which must consider doing the will of the Lord in the face of daunting tasks. Few does not mean failure. It could mean faithfulness. The failure would be pride in smallness. It is obvious that the Lord desires the flock to grow, but not at the expense of bringing in "wolves" (Acts 20:17-35). Each member of the flock can seek to tell others of the saving grace of Jesus, teaching the value of redemption and biblical principles. Jesus as the Shepherd will provide for His flock.

The message of our text is to care for things spiritual and not become covetous. A continual guard must be maintained not to seek to impress the world. The book of Revelations speaks of seven churches that needed to consider spiritual as opposed to physical. A congregation's worth to the Lord is faithfulness. He encourages them to grow in the nurture and admonition the Lord. Success in the Lord's sight is service. Quality of living is of more value than quantity. Don Hatch
