**Participation:** Arrive early to greet and welcome visitors. Sitting near the front encourages everyone. Stick around afterward, greet the visitors and invite them back. Extend hospitality by inviting them home or to a restaurant for a snack.

**Involvement:** During the services sing in a spiritual manner with grace in your heart. Give a hearty emphasis to the scriptures by bringing and using your Bible. Help those unacquainted with the Bible to find the place so they can read along with the preacher.

## A Message from Our Shepherds

I would like to share some thoughts about vain religion as taken from Wayne Jackson's book entitled "Notes from the Margin of My Bible" Volume I Old Testament.

"It is commonly believed by many that so long as a person is religious—in some generic way—he is well pleasing to God. The notion is popular that man is free to direct his own manner of service to the Creator. And for many, there is little connection between one's

religious exercises and his daily life. Worship God-then live as you please-is the sentiment of legions.

Amos goes right to the heart of this philosophy when he speaks for God: *I hate, I despise your feast days, and I do not savor your sacred assemblies.* Though you offer Me burnt offerings and your grain offerings, I will not accept them, nor will I regard your fattened peace offerings (Amos 5:21-22).

Insincere worship—worship divorced from justice and righteousness is vain. But let justice run down like water, and righteousness like a mighty stream (verse 24). Thus, block off these two verses and in your margin note: Religious ritualism, detached from godly living, is vain."

May we all be conscious of how we worship and what we worship and our attitude about worship. This is a serious problem in our society today and it is our job as Christians to uphold the truth as we read about in the scriptures.

#### We All Need Somebody

The above caption is a familiar saying to each of us. *We all need somebody!* Children depend upon parents for their needs. God planned the home to where each member would need the other members (Ephesians 6:1-4). When one member fails to fulfill his part, the home begins to disintegrate and fall apart.

Through personal work, people are able to receive the "touch of the Master's hand." Jesus reached out during His earthly ministry to touch the little children (Matthew 19:13), the sick, the leper, the broken-hearted, and the dead (Luke 9:2). Today, He continues to reach out through His body, the church. Christ is reaching out through you and me to accomplish His will.

Somebody needs us! How are we extending the "touch of the Master's hand"? It is a serious business, brethren! We all need to give this some thought; pray about it; be as serious as we possibly can be about the Father's business.

We are promised that God will not forget our labors, "For God is not unjust to forget your work and labor of love which you have shown toward His name, in that you have ministered to the saints, and do minister" (Hebrews 6:10).
