God Is Faithful

Faith is believing something because it is more reasonable to believe the evidence presented than to disbelieve it. Faith is the spiritual action taken by man to unite his soul with God in salvation. Faith binds the soul to the Creator in unity of purpose and endeavor. Faithfulness and trustworthiness form a foundation for fidelity [faith]. Fidelity has a passive and active involvement in things holy. Trust develops into a quality of life which envisions serving God in word and deed (Col 3:7; Gal 5:22). Faithfulness seeks continual association with godliness and righteousness which are fundamental to strengthening character. Faithfulness is trusting God's guidance and leaning on His promises. Confidence and trust often times could fit the context where faith is found. Trust and reliance are realistic alternatives to the word faith.

The body of truth called "the faith" is traceable to a sense of value placed upon the importance of characterizing God as faithful. If God is not faithful it is apparent that man has no foundation for faith. Moses learned to trust that God was faithful, slow to anger and maintained a love for His people (Ex 34:1-7). The law proclaimed God's faithfulness, who does no wrong, is upright and just (Deut 32:4). God's love reaches to His creation. His righteousness and justice preserve mankind (Psm 36:1-6). Seeing God's faithfulness gives reason to praise Him and sing of redemption (Psm 71:21-25). Marking God's faithfulness, known from generation to generation, preserves and sustains each generation because God's love stands firm (Psm 89:1, 2). The Lord God is Almighty and His faithfulness surrounds us (Psm 89:8). Righteousness and justice are the foundation of His throne; love and faithfulness go before Him (Psm 89:14). God is the refuge for His children and His faithfulness is their shield and rampart (Psm 91:4). The Psalmist proclaimed God's love morning, noon and night (Psm 92:1-6). Giving thanks to God is because He is good, His love endures and His faithfulness continues throughout the generations of man (Psm 100:1-5). In God's faithfulness He establishes everlasting covenants (Isa 61:1-9). "This I recall to my mind; therefore have I hope. It is of Jehovah's lovingkindnesses that we are not

consumed, because his compassions fail not they are new every morning; great is thy faithfulness. Jehovah is my portion, saith my soul; therefore will I hope in him" (Lam 3:23, 24). God's faithfulness promises that we will be provided a way of escape in times of temptation (1 Cor 10:13). He can cleanse mankind from sin and remain faithful by giving peace and sanctification (1 Thes 5:23). He strengthens and protects His children from the evil one (2 Thes 3:3). God's children can have confidence to go before His throne with a sincere heart in full assurance that they have been cleansed from a guilty conscience. God unswervingly gives hope to those who seek to please Him with love and good deeds (Heb 10:19-24).

Faith is not a creed. The profitability of faith is the ethic of work. Demons believe and shutter but do not do the work which arises from faithful living (Eph 2:1-10). The illustration of a brother or sister naked or in some need is used to demonstrate that at some point in a faithful person's life they believe and give their goods in order that a need might be fulfilled (Acts 2:43-47; Act 4:32-37; 5:1-11; Jas 2:14-25). The riddle of works of faith is answered, faith without works is dead. One says they have faith without works, another manifests faith by works and by works faith is made perfect (Jas 2:14-25). Faith normally has confidence and hope. God is reliable and trustworthy. The substance of faith is the evidence that others have had faith in God and He has never been seen to have vicissitudes. Faith is not a mysterious intuition into the spiritual world. Faith has evidence upon which to build its superstructure. Abraham, Moses, Rahab are evidentiary presentations of a simple reliance and how it enables a believer to treat the future as the present and the invisible as seen. Faith is the power of knowledge and not an arbitrary arrangement of facts without the benefit of pardon, justification, purification, life, peace and the hope of glory (Jn17). Faith is the watchword of Christianity. It is the supreme means of pleasing God (Heb 11:6).

Faith is reliance on the love, peace, purity and confidence that God knows the answer to each issue of life and will significantly supply all that is needed if we remain faithfully engaged in obedience. Mankind must adjust their nature to live mercifully and righteously in our present world and maintain good works which is good and profitable unto mankind (Tit 3:1-11). Faith is our side of the union with Christ. It is the means of possessing all His benefits, pardon, justification, purification, life, glory and peace. It removes anxiety and reinforces that prayer and supplications with thanksgiving bring a peace that passes understanding (Phil 4:4-7). God is faithful!

A Message from Our Shepherds

Sunday night, Stephen Ashcraft and I flew to Accra, Ghana. We met our missionary, Willie Gley. Willie took me to visit our Clearing Agent (for the ocean containers), Sampson Maclean. Sampson is also an elder in the Lord's church. I was able to view the remaining boxes of our shipment of tracts at the new church building in Accra that will be distributed in next month's campaign. We discussed different methods of transporting our containers to different cities in Ghana. Four of the largest cities in Ghana; Accra (2 million plus), Kumasi (1.5 million), Tamale (.5 million), and Takaradi (350,000) are being visited. Wednesday, we flew to Tamale in the north. It is about 90% Islamic. Stephen has been instrumental in building a large new facility for the preaching school and helping the church grow in that area. Tony Johnson also works with him by teaching the students and caring for the facility. Tony lives almost full time at the school as Stephen travels to all the Bear Valley preaching schools in West Africa. We have had three good days with the staff here at the Tamale Institute of Biblical Studies. Wednesday, I went to view their new building. Thursday, several preachers and students gathered to learn about Mission Printing and how they can help distribute the tracts. This was encouraging to see how many were excited about receiving some tools to do their job of saving the lost and strengthening the church. I was blessed to bring the lesson, 'The Great Commission' on Thursday night at the East Tamale church of Christ. They are in the process of completing their new building and they meet outside in the dark (two small lights). We were joined with some friends, mosquitoes (malaria transporters) and bats that were hanging overhead in a tree. Friday we are going to a meeting with the teachers and staff in Tamale. Saturday, we are driving to Kumasi in the central part of Ghana. My health is improving

Delivered From Fear

"I sought the LORD, and He heard me, and delivered me from all my fears." (Psalm 34:4)

Fear has a purpose and is a natural feeling arising from an expectancy of harm. It will alert an individual to the existence of peril allowing for evasion and awakening all personal powers to keep the circumstance at bay. Fear can be unreasonable and tormenting. Religious conviction has never originated in fear, since mankind has been commanded to draw near to God and learn of His love. In Christianity there is an awe and reverence prompted by love. "This is the end of the matter; all hath been heard: fear God, and keep his commandments; for this is the whole duty of man. For God will bring every work into judgment, with every hidden thing, whether it be good, or whether it be evil" (Eccl 12:13, 14). Reverence is not a dread of God. It is respect and love with regard which prompts an individual to seek the pleasure of God, in word and deed. Actions must be tempered with knowledge of punishment for disobedience. Reverence is an attitude which cherishes fellowship with the Almighty (Prov 1:7; Psm 34:11; Jer 2:19; Ex 23:27). Worship and awe are manifested by keeping God's commandments, walking in the light of His ways, doing His will and avoiding sin (Ex 20:20; Prov 8:13).

Wisdom which comes from above does not teach a recompense of evil, but rather blessings, forgiveness and mercy (Jas 3:13-16). Spiritual individuals seek the wisdom of God to know the pathway of holiness and faithful obedience. "And we know and have believed the love which God hath in us. God is love; and he that abideth in love abideth in God. and God abideth in him. Herein is love made perfect with us, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment; because as he is, even so are we in this world. There is no fear in love: but perfect love casteth out fear, because fear hath punishment; and he that feareth is not made perfect in love. We love, because he first loved us" (1 Jn 4:16-19). Children of God are forgiven, protected and loved. Fear is a natural consequence of sin. God lifts up mankind to consider a life beyond the physical (1 Cor 15:50-58). Obedience has courage which is conjoined with humility causing the child of God to believe in eternal life (1 Jn 5:13-21). God is our Deliverer from evil and its dangers (Psm 23:4). God is manifested as a loving and forgiving God, who gives mankind a spirit of sonship (Rom 8:15; 2 Tim 1:7; 1 Jn 4:18).

The faithful are invited to appear before the throne of God to find grace and confident assurance (Heb 4:16; 10:19). Reverence and awe for the greatness of God should never be displaced when He allows us to approach Him. It would be a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God, having trodden underfoot the relationship which is the highest fellowship mankind is able to procure, through the blood of Jesus Christ. The good news of salvation is that Jesus sets mankind free from fear. We can boldly say that "the Lord is our helper; I will not fear: what shall man do to me?" Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever and through Him we offer a sacrifice of praise. Living honorably, the God of peace will make us His servants to do every good thing, working in us what is well-pleasing in His sight through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory forever and ever (Heb 13). **Don Hatch**
