Salvation Don Hatch

No theme deserves a more careful and prayerful consideration than salvation. It was the absolute mission of Jesus Christ to procure salvation for Adam's race. The answers why Jesus had to come, why He was willing to give up His glory, why He became human are all answered in the scheme of redemption called "Salvation". When Jesus became incarnate, lived, died, arose and ascended to the right-hand of the Father it was the manifested destiny of how God would apply saving grace, justification and reconciliation. Jesus was willing to set aside His glory for the sorrow of the humanity. He came to save sinners (1 Tim 1:15). He left the glory of heaven becoming a teacher, preacher of righteousness and model of virtue, but moreover He came to declare salvation for Adam's race. His name Jesus means Savior (Matt 1:18-20). His name carries with it deliverance from sin, guilt and the power of Satan (Heb 2:1-18; Rom 3:21-30). The name Jesus is matchless and wonderful.

The Bible is employed to teach mankind about Jesus and salvation. It contains the only divinely approved means of receiving redemption from sin. Such provisions remove helplessness and hopelessness from the heart, soul and mind of the redeemed. All past sins are forgiven, forgotten and removed to nevermore be remembered by God. Where hell had been the destiny of the lost, heaven now became the hope of salivation in Christ Jesus. Being hopeless and without a covenant with God are replaced with a New Covenant and abiding hope (Eph 2:1-22). There is no other name given under heaven wherein man can be saved, but Jesus (Acts 4:12). To refuse Jesus' invitation and reject salvation through Him is to face eternity unprepared and a judgment beyond what man can understand (2 Thess 1:6-10; Heb 2:3). Salvation is indispensible and beyond estimation. All that can be known about salvation is found in the Bible.

Neglect is constantly warned against in the Bible and the proportion of the risk while engaged in neglect is found in the question, "what will a man give in exchange for his soul?" or "what has a man given his soul for?" The Bible uses terms like deliverance from physical and spiritual blights when one turns to God and is submissive to His will. Salvation is a great manifestation of the love, grace and mercy of God. Peerlessly salvation is well named as "so

great a salvation" (Heb 2:1-5). It is universal in scope but restricted to those who are faithfully obedient (Rom 1:1-5; 16:26). God's redemptive act possesses justification, redemption, propitiation, grace, mercy, forgiveness, sanctification and glorification. Everything which touches salvation has the imprint of God's eternal love. This salvation antedates creation and was conceived in the mind of God according to His eternal purpose (Eph 1:3-15; 3:11; Tit 1:2). It was a premeditated plan which met the needs and was no after-thought because of a sudden emergency. In eternity its foundation was established. God endorsed it with His sanction and holiness. God is the source of salvation. He commended His love toward mankind while they were sinners (Rom 5:1-5). He determined that mankind must be holy and without blemish before they could have fellowship with Him (Eph 1:3-6). When God makes a promise it is kept (Tit 1:2). Salvation is great because the price was Jesus Christ (1 Cor 6:20; Acts 20:28).

Neglect and rejection of this incomparable salvation is to make a terrible mistake which will affect one's eternal life. Creation was a great work. God spoke and it was done. Salvation is greater because it took the life of God's Son on a cross to procure it. A child who is of the age of accountability can understand salivation and can say "what must I do to be saved?" Jesus bestows blessing upon the lives of those who faithfully obey Him (Mat 20:28; 2 or 5:21; Heb 2:14, 15; 1 Pet 1:19).

Salvation is great because of the agency by which it was procured. The blood of Jesus made the action of salvation possible (Acts 20:28; Tit 3:3-5). It is great because of the blessings it bestows. It offers emancipation from sin and the devil (Col 1:11-15). It provides a perfect relationship with the Father (2 Cor 6:14-7:1). Salvation brings satisfaction, pardon and justification. Our eternal salvation is in the Lord (Eph 1:3). It awakens in us a ceaseless joy, undying gratitude and desire to reach the ultimate goal of eternal life with our God. This incorruptible inheritance proclaims that there is an avenue to the Father for the lost who are without one plea and must depend on divine mercy (1 Pet 1:4, 5; Heb 5:9; 9:12; Jn 10:28). Man is prone to forget how great salvation is and that it is not something but someone (Isa 12:2). If salvation is treated with indifference, as elusive mankind will struggle to see how wonderful it is. If salvation is in Him and because of Him it would be ludicrous to make it an object of indifference.

Salvation is a "now", a current and ever-present blessing (2 Cor 6:2; Lk 19:9). It would be folly to look upon salvation as a long laborious process wherein one must struggle to receive it. This does not mean we are not to work out our salvation with fear and trembling (Phil 2:12-18). Once it is received it is vested and fully granted. Moment by moment we are kept in His love and grace. We have a present and a future in salvation (Rom 13:11). We keep salvation as we believe and respond to God. The penalty, power and ruthlessness of sin are removed by salvation.

Great Is the Lord

"O give thanks unto Jehovah, call upon his name; Make known his doings among the peoples. Sing unto him, sing praises unto him; Talk ye of all his marvelous works. Glory ye in his holy name; Let the heart of them rejoice that seek Jehovah. Seek ye Jehovah and his strength; Seek his face evermore. Remember his marvelous works that he hath done, His wonders, and the judgments of his mouth, O ye seed of Israel his servant, Ye children of Jacob, his chosen ones. He is Jehovah our God; His judgments are in all the earth. Remember his covenant for

ever, The word which he commanded to a thousand generations, The covenant which he made with Abraham, And his oath unto Isaac, And confirmed the same unto Jacob for a statute, To Israel for an everlasting covenant, Saying, Unto thee will I give the land of Canaan, The lot of your inheritance; When ye were but a few men in number, Yea, very few, and sojourners in it; And they went about from nation to nation, And from one kingdom to another people. He suffered no man to do them wrong; Yea, he reproved kings for their sakes, Saying, Touch not mine anointed ones, And do my prophets no harm. Sing unto Jehovah, all the earth; Show forth his salvation from day to day. Declare his glory among the nations, His marvelous works among all the peoples. For great is Jehovah, and greatly to be praised: He also is to be feared above all gods. For all the gods of the peoples are idols: But Jehovah made the heavens. Honor and majesty are before him: Strength and gladness are in his place. Ascribe unto Jehovah, ye kindreds of the peoples, Ascribe unto Jehovah glory and strength; Ascribe unto Jehovah the glory due unto his name: Bring an offering, and come before him: Worship Jehovah in holy array. Tremble before him, all the earth: The world also is established that it cannot be moved" (1 Chron 16:8-30).

This great passage is a **Psalm**, a **Hymn** and words of **Spiritual** proclivity (Eph 5:18-20; Col 3:15-18). It was composed when the Ark of the Lord was being brought back to Jerusalem. The uniqueness of this song is the expression of gratitude and deliverance. Jehovah blessed them abundantly (Eph 3:20, 21).

Jehovah was not a tribal-god or one graven by the hand of man. He was greater than Dagon, the fish-god of the Philistines from whom David had taken the Ark of the Covenant. Gods of wood, stone, metal and graven by man are false no-gods. Idols are forbidden to be worshiped (1 Jn 5:21; Acts 15:29). Such worship is vain (Ex 20:4-6).

The living God of the Bible is the only true God. It is He who made heaven, earth and things therein. He is our Creator and Sustainer (Heb 1:1-5). No other God is like our God. He is wonderful, mighty and awesome. When He speaks the world shutters, nations rise and fall, peoples of the earth are ruled by Him (Rom 13:1-7). His works are marvelous among all the people. Ascribe to Him glory, strength and bring offerings to Him. Let all the earth tremble before Him. All honor and glory be given unto Him. Give thanks and call upon the Lord God. Sing praises to His name, rejoice and seek His favor. He is wonderful and His judgments are true and righteous. Great is the Lord.
