Should Not the Shepherds Feed the Flock?

In the book of Ezekiel chapter 34, God told Ezekiel to prophesy to the shepherds a question, "Should not the shepherds feed the flocks?" (Ezek. 34:2) In vs. 34 He said, "... The weak you have not strengthened, nor have you healed those who were sick, nor bound up the broken, nor brought back what was driven away, nor sought what was lost; but with force and cruelty you have ruled them." As a result, the sheep were scattered and they had become food for the beasts of the field. (Ezek. 34:5) The Shepherds clearly had a responsibility to provide for all of the needs of the sheep of their flock.

The Shepherds of today are our Elders. (1 Pet. 5:2-3) The Bible says that the Holy Spirit has chosen them as overseers to guard the flock. (Acts 20:28-29) Titus was told to appoint Elders to set things in order to provide those things that were lacking. (Titus 1:5) Whether the Elders provide the spiritual food themselves (1 Tim. 5:17; 1 Peter 5:1; 2 Jn 1:1) or they oversee, direct, and validate the food provided by others, they remain responsible for feeding the flock. (Titus 1:9-11) For three years Paul went from house to house preaching the "whole counsel of God." (Acts 20:18-32)

The Elders in the first century faced challenges and hindrances in feeding their flocks. Not only did they have to deal with false teachers (2 Pet. 2:1-3; 1 Jn. 4:1) spreading lies and deceit, they had to stand firm/fast for a doctrine that at this time was primarily verbal. The flocks had to be fed through verbal teaching/preaching and then memorization of those teachings. It was through preaching and hearing the Word of God that faith was established. (Rom. 10:14, 17) They had the Old Testament but the New Testament was not in written form in its entirety and readily available as we have today. (Acts 17:11; 1 Tim. 4:13) The Gospels were in the process of being written. Epistles and letters were being circulated among the churches but not in complete final book form.

Today we not only have the completed gospel delivered once for all to the saints (Jude 1:3), we also have tremendous resources available for Elders to disseminate that information and feed the flock. Virtually everyone in this country has access to the Bible in some form. Whether written, verbal, or electronically, flocks today can easily be fed by the Shepherds.

But Elders today can still face difficult circumstances when it comes to feeding the flock. As should be, the importance and emphasis is on the message rather than the venue by which the message is delivered or received. Some congregations, and specifically Elderships, are being criticized today for how they are feeding the flock while trying to also consider the safety and well being of the flock. If the flock is being fed and cared for by the Shepherds, I find this criticism disingenuous and outside of God's word. I would strongly urge caution among these critics. God does not take kindly to those that oppose His chosen spokespersons doing His will. (Num. 12:1-9)
