

Exodus, the second book of the Pentateuch, is about the departure of the children of Israel from the land of bondage. It is a history of God's promises to Abraham and subsequent generations. 400 years after God gave the promises to Abraham the children of Israel were in bondage. The Hyksos, (Shepherd Kings), had been dethroned as Pharaohs. The Pharaoh on the throne did not remember the benefit Joseph had brought to Egypt. This land of Ham, where Joseph had been second to Pharaoh, was committing the atrocities of killing male Hebrew babies.

Famous Egyptologist, Sir Findres Petrie, said Egypt's original religion had been monotheistic (worshipping one God) but had seditiously gone into polytheism. They worshipped many no-gods including **Apes**-a bull, **Amon**-a cow, **Mut**-a vulture, **Horus**-a hawk, **Set**-a crocodile, **Osiris**-a goat, **Thath**-a frog, **Nechebt**-a serpent, the **Nile** River and other no-gods.

The promise given to Jacob on his departure from Canaan was perfectly fulfilled by God (Gen 46: 1-13). The children of Israel settled in the most fruitful province of the fertile land of Egypt. When the children of Israel where oppressed God came in judgment and delivered them from the Egyptians (Gen 15:13).

During his time Moses, his life, works and the writing of the Pentateuch (first five books of the Old Testament) made a major impact on world history. From 70 people, in 430 short years, they became a multitude. At the time of the Exodus there were 600,000 men above 20 years of age, besides wives, children, the aged and the non-Israelites. This multitude could have been over two million people. Israel's numbers seemed to double every 25 years even in the face of danger and servitude. Their cherished hope was the promised land of milk and honey, a national homeland.

The family record of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob were communicated by the Patriarchs creating a cherished dream of the Promised Land. Moses, a prophet, wrote by inspiration the history of the beginning of the world and progress of nations. Egypt, the most advanced civilization of that day, had become a world empire. Following Israel's exodus Egypt languished into a second rate nation. Moses, well educated (Acts 7:22), chose to share ill treatment with the people of God, rather than to enjoy the pleasure of sin for a season; accounting the reproach of Christ greater riches than the riches of Egypt: for he looked unto the recompense of the reward (Hebrews 11:25, 26). Moses was remarkable because of his leadership, statesmanship, legislative capacity, piety, and loyalty to Jehovah.

An outline of Exodus is the account of Israel, enslavement, Moses, contest with Pharaoh's magicians, 10 plagues, crossing of the Red Sea, Mt. Sinai, wilderness wanderings and the Tabernacle.

Continued from right column... will be reward enough for the faithful (Matt 25:21, 23). Those who wear the armor of God, walk in the light with righteousness are a privileged band of heroes. The highest honor is to have fellowship with Jesus himself. Jesus is depicted in the scriptures as the "Faithful and True; and in righteousness he doth judge and make war" (Rev 19:11-17). Paul ended his life saying he had "fought the good fight, I have kept the faith" (2 Tim 4:7).

Servant

Good is described as a character or constitution which has a beneficial effect. It has a moral sense and is attributed to things and people. God is essentially absolutely good (Matt 19:17; Mk 10:18; Lk 18:19). In certain cases men are called good (Matt 25:21; Acts 11:24; Titus 2:5).

Good is morally pleasing to God and therefore beneficial. Christians are to <u>prove</u> what is good (Rom 12:1-5), <u>cleave</u> to it (Rom 12:9), <u>do</u> it (Rom 13:3; Gal 6:10; 1 Pet 3:11), <u>work</u> at it (Rom 2:10; Eph 4:28; 6:8), <u>follow</u> after it (1 Thes 5:15), be <u>zealous</u> of it (1 Pet 3:13) and <u>overcome</u> evil with it (Rom 12:21).

The first parable of the sower is about the types of soil into which good seeds are sown. The effects of the evil one are fully seen. In spite of problems some seed grew (Matt 13:18-23). The second parable is about the enemy sowing tares among the good seed. Jesus said there would be a harvest, the tares burned and the good saved (Matthew 13:24-30).

Governmental authorities should be ministers of good (Rom 13:4). Governments are to benefit the spread of good. When those in high places defer to that which is evil God has set the bounds and habitations of nations and will judge them (Acts 17:22-28).

The Christian is to be a "**good soldier**" (2 Tim 2:3, 4). This metaphor is very fitting. Christ is the Captain of our souls and we as soldiers have a standing appointment with the forces of evil within and without (Eph 6:1-16).

A good soldier is:

1. <u>Acknowledged</u>- chosen- Not everyone is fitted to be a solider of Christ. Moral and spiritual defects hinder one from being a good solider of Jesus Christ. Hence one needs to remove moral or spiritual blemishes to be able to stand in the battle against sin (Eph 6:10-16; Col 3:5-11). One needs to put on the armour of righteousness and light (Rom 13:12; 2 Cor 6:7). The solider is chosen of God. God determines what is morally and spiritually fitting for the solider (Rom 8:31-39).

2. <u>Separated</u>- not entangled with the affairs of this life. Anything which would hinder one's ability to be valiant and faithful must be discarded. Seeking the kingdom of heaven first is an equivalent ideal (Matt 6:33, 34). Everyone should make necessary changes in their personal life to fit the righteousness required by God. We may be in the world but not of the world (Jn 17:14-26). The Christian has a high and noble calling and should be seeking to escape from corruption (2 Peter 1:3-11). Many have lived honorable lives by laying aside every weight of sin which easily besets (Heb 11:32-12:13). Their avocations ranged from kings to pruner of sycamore trees (1 Sam 16; Amos 7:14); wives to warrior (1 Pet 3:6; Jdg 4).

3. <u>Sanctified</u>- choosing to **please** him who enrolled him as a soldier. Presenting of one's life to the Lord in an acceptable manner is to choose not to be fashioned according to the world and is a formidable concept for soldiers (Rom 12:1-5). Pious manner of living is an inherent reputation and moral goodness. Virtue is essentially an exercise of faithfulness in the face of all enemies (1 Pet 2:9-10).

4. **<u>Preserved</u>**- enduring hardship with others as a good soldier. Knowing that the way will be fraught with foes should never detour the soldier from his appointed task of doing good. "Be not dismayed whatever betides God, will take care of you...when dangers fierce your path assail... God will take care of you, thro' everyday, O'er all the way; He will take care of you, God will take care of you"¹ "...for himself hath said, I will in no wise fail thee, neither will I in any wise forsake thee. So that with good courage we say, The Lord is my helper; I will not fear; what shall man do unto me?" (Heb 13:5, 6)
