


Image of God

Image (Greek εικονισ) is a word which embraces the twin ideas of representation and manifestation. Adam's race bears his image in flesh and blood (1 Corinthians 15:49). Such a representation is derived from a prototype. The prototype was man, not monkey. There is a flesh of beast, birds and fish which are not represented in mankinds. Evolution is a false Man has within himself representation of God which is spiritual. Mankind became a visible image of God's spiritual essence (1 Corinthians 11:7). This is a fundamental concept of the Bible (Psalm 139).

In the Mosaic account of creation and subsequent teaching in the New Testament, man was made in the image of God (Genesis 1:26; 1 Corinthians 15:35-49). The general likeness of God is the excellency of spiritual purity. A child is born sinless and bears in the inner being the image of God. When sin intervenes the image is damaged and renewal or restoration is needed and has been offered by God (Ephesians 4:17-24). Restoration implies the image lost in sin can be revived (formed back again into a holy spiritual nature Acts 3:18-26).

The image of God in man is clearly an inner being. We are called the "offspring of God" (Acts 17:28; 2 Corinthians 4:16-18). Man's representation of God is a high and noble image. Created and given a foundation of moral goodness man can be distinguished from all other forms of creation. Moral qualities lost in sin are renewed in mortification of things of the flesh and obedience to the principles of becoming a new creature (Colossians 3:5-11). Man's fall did not fully annihilate (efface) the image of God within them. There is an ability to restore and renovate the quality of goodness, love and purity within man. In sin man ceases to be a perfect vehicle and representation of God. What man lost by sin, God through Christ, can recover through mercy and grace in the regeneration (Ephesians 2).

Faithful obedient disciples of Christ seek the glorified state of representing Christ to the world (Romans 8:29; 1 Corinthians 15:49). Within the perfect work of divine grace a sinner is restored to the spiritual likeness of his Creator (i.e. the image of God 2 Corinthians 4:4-6). The invisible, but not imperceptible,

image suggests that what God is man must represent. "Likeness" stresses the resemblance of an "archetype", God. God's moral goodness can be lived out in the life of a Christian. Character (Greek χαρακηρ) means impression or stamp, bearing the image of the impression which produced it. Christ was the very image and essence of God the Father (Hebrews 1:3). Therefore a Christian who looks like Christ is also a manifestation of God. As a coin, statute or other items bear the "image" of a prototype (first form) man must also bear the image of God. The relationship of God, Christ and man is that male and female were created in the image of God (Genesis 1:26, 27).

Being an image, essentially a replica of God is seen in man and identifies the responsibility to be like God. Adam was the original human. "Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin: and so death passed upon all, for all have sinned" (Romans 5:12; 3:23). Yet, man can be an accountable and suitable demonstration of the virtue and beauty of God. The work of divine grace presents to believers a resource for a spiritual and moral character essential and absolute if there is to be hope.

"Wherefore gird up the loins of your mind, be sober, and hope to the end for the grace that is to be brought unto you at the revelation of Jesus Christ; As obedient children, not fashioning yourselves according to the former lusts in your ignorance: But as he which hath called you is holy, so be ye holy in all manner of conversation; Because it is written, be ye holy; for I am holy. And if ye call on the Father, who without respect of persons judgeth according to every man's work, pass the time of your sojourning here in fear: Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot:..." (1 Peter 1:13-25).

The image of God in man is fundamental to Christian theology. It is rooted in the Bible wherever the creation of man is put forward. After sin entered into the world, with the subsequent corruption, a presentation of the need to be reconciled was manifested (2 Cor 5:11-19). Integrating sin into an individual's life is represented as a separation of mankind from God spiritually. All references of the individual's inner being is represented as being in the likeness of the Creator. The high and noble figure demonstrated is when an individual is reconciled to God and the soul is redeemed (Acts 2:38).

A Christian passes from this life with a hope of being incorruptible and immortal. The victory is to be with God and in His image once again (1 Cor 15:50-58).

"And he said unto them, These are my words which I spake unto you, while I was yet with you, that all things must needs be fulfilled, which are written in the law of Moses, and the prophets, and the psalms, concerning me. (Lk 24:44-49).

Moses' Song

In Deuteronomy 32 and 33 Moses, under divine injunction, composed an ode to be recited and sung as a witness of God's greatness. Moses' death had been pronounced and his song contrasts the changelessness and faithfulness of God with the past and subsequent nefariousness [wickedness] of Israel.

The poem is divided into six parts, the **importance of doctrine**, **blamelessness and excellency of Jehovah** compared to Israel's rebellion, the **folly of ingratitude**, the **purpose of punishment**, how **God fulfills his purpose** with mercy and justice, and how **God protects** the faithful.

This ode displays the genius of inspired poetry in giving such a sacred song its special place in history. Moses is displayed as a man of understanding, a writer of legislation and a skilled orator. The ode gives a vivacious dictation for Israel to elevate their love for God. The beauty, character and remarkable blessings which had been given to Israel needed to be recalled to stir piety, earnest desire to serve and zeal to honor and reverence God. This ode is set forth like a mirror for seeing providential blessings or punishments in the past, present and future as a new generation was to receive the heritage. The next generation would be entrusted with a "precious faith" which was being handed down at great cost. In the hard school of experience the former generation could commend "a faith" based upon a deep conviction that God had been able to deliver them. This new generation must seek the high ground of moral purity. They were to keep this high ground free from any alien faiths, while occupying already cleared ground and maintaining its moral purity.

The Giver of life always allows the faithful to "count their many blessings" and see that their "cup runs over". Blessings of the past assured the next generation, **if faithful**, they would live in the presence of God, know He heard their prayers, be a protected people, being fruitful, happy and satisfied.

God had been the giver of all good and perfect things and was the Saviour of His people, Israel. He had supplied every need. Only a mad man would treat the sacred and solemn things which God had supplied with contempt and disavow them as empty and vain. There are awful realities of life which none can afford to treat lightly. The stern fact, which should awaken all, is that present choices determine the future with irrevocable blessings or woes. Blessings are expected because of ardent love and obedience to God. God establishes, assures and blesses his people.

"Now we that are strong ought to bear the infirmities of the weak, and not to please ourselves. Let each one of us please his neighbor for that which is good, unto edifying. For Christ also pleased not himself; but, as it is written, the reproach of them that reproached thee fell upon me. For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that through patience and through comfort of the scriptures we might have hope. Now the God of patience and comfort grant you to be of the same mind one with another according to Christ Jesus: that with one accord ye may with one mouth glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 15:1-5). In varying degrees each generation builds upon the past. Conditions for success in the future are to understand the purposes of God, maintain an obedient faith, remember His promises and **turn not** to the right or to the left hand that all may have good success whithersoever they go, pressing on to the high calling in Christ Jesus. **Don Hatch**
