THE DESTINY OF MANKIND

The **Summer Preaching Series** will start June 2nd. Brother Perry Cotham will be our first speaker. He has written a wonderful book "Beyond The Sunset". Many have read this book and have commented on how valuable it is to them. The other speakers will preach on various subjects.

"If a man die, shall he live again" (Job 14:14)? This question was propounded mililleums ago. Job, the patriarch in the midst of his afflictions, wanted to know about his destiny. This question has haunted every race and nationality of mankind. Recognizing the brevity of life, the passing and transitory nature of mankind, men have wondered if there is life beyond the grave. In being true to their best instincts most of mankind finds it exceedingly difficult to believe that there is no existence beyond the grave.

It is a truism that the Creator made it possible for mankind to satisfy every genuine human desire. Since longing for everlasting life is a genuine human desire it is reasonable to conclude that this too is a part of God's eternal plan. It would be as logical for mankind to believe that there is <u>no</u> food, clothing and shelter in the world to satisfy human needs, as for them to have a desire for eternal life and God not to supply a solution for this genuine desire.

Mankind's innate sense of justice brings about an acute awareness that something is needed to complete life. Even the most content among us knows that this life is incomplete. What an utter failure if death ends it all.

A powerful argument can be made for a future life based upon the reality of God and the value He placed upon His highest creation, man. There is a subsequent fellowship that each individual can have in true religion. Those who believe in the reality of God recognize that man and woman are made in the image of God, having within themselves the spark of divinity, being of more value than the entire physical universe and that they can therefore come into fellowship with God. The idea of all existence ending in the grave is unthinkable. Anyone who denies the doctrine of immortality is denying the intrinsic value of a human personality. Either he has doubted the Creator God and His creation, or he holds that it is possible God should desire the annihilation of the soul He made in His image. From this comes the belief that there is no God, thus no high value on human life.

In true religion there is the experiencing of the responding love of God and fellowship that He provides in life and beyond. In true religion man is bound to God in fellowship: spirit meets Spirit and mankind responds to the love of God. The experience of Enoch, Abraham, Moses and Elijah are all verifiable proofs of life after the physical life. To say that there is no life after death is **to deny** that God loves us, which is unthinkable. It is entirely inconsistent that God

would love us with an everlasting love and then have it end at the grave. Is it possible that He would cast us off as just so much rubbish? God declares that when we are faithful nothing can snatch us from His love, not even death, powers, principalities, things present, things to come, or any other creature. **We are more than conquerors through Him that loved us (**Rom 8:31-39).
