

Yes, Lord!

The term "yes" is to consent, agree, to express or cast an affirmative vote. Within the word "yes" is the eagerness to help and sometimes the inquiry about "how can I help"? When spoken emphatically it expresses satisfaction, agreement, pleasure and inquiry about a state of wellbeing. It is an affirmative reply; more gracious than "yap" (which is a slang noisy, jabber considered a crude demonstration from Webster's contempt College Dictionary).

In the following passages we see ways individuals used "Yes Lord". "Believe ye that I am able to do this? (heal blindness). They say unto him, Yea, Lord" (Matthew 9:29). "Have ye understood all these things? (Parables spoken by the Lord). They say unto him, Yea, Lord" (Matthew 13:51). "Believest thou this? (that Jesus was the resurrection). She saith unto him, Yea, Lord" (John 11:27). "So when they had broken their fast, Jesus saith to Simon Peter, Simon, son of John, lovest (agape) thou me more than these? He said unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love (philo) thee. He saith to him, Feed my lambs. He saith to him a second time, Simon, son of John, lovest (agape) thou me? He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love (philo) thee. He saith unto him, Tend my sheep. He saith unto him the third time, Simon, son of John, lovest [philo] thou me? Peter was grieved because he said unto him the third time, Lovest [philo] thou me? And he said unto him, Lord thou knowest that I love [philo] thee. Jesus saith, unto him, feed my sheep". In this passage there is a play on words where Jesus uses the Greek word love (agape, αγαπε great love] and Peter uses the Greek word love (philo, φιλω sincere friendship]. It is evident that Peter was too timid to express the agape form of love after his failure to affirm fellowship with Jesus in the court of Caiaphas and other moments of unbelief (Matthew 26:69-75; Mark 16:14; John 21:3). No words are more beautiful than "Yes, Lord", or more difficult to say when faced with failure and despair.

Saying "Yes" to Jesus is the secret of **salvation**, **holiness**, **hopefulness** and **peace**. There is a lowliness and **deep humility** which comes from the lips of those who confess Jesus. Distress is a defining moment when Jesus can be trusted above all others. "Footprints of Jesus make the pathway glow; we will follow the steps of Jesus where'er they go."

"Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" was the question. The reply was "Here am I; send me" (Isaiah 6:8). Such a noble heart trusted God and affirmed a willingness to be used. Legendary hearts invited God to consider them for the challenging things of life. Success is found in dealing with difficult circumstances. Sometimes like Peter, who had failed, individuals need to brush themselves off and go back to the task with renewed zeal. Not everyone can have the confidence of Isaiah. But all should grow this **confidence**.

Accepting Jesus at his word displays certainty and resolution. Challenges which are great are not undertaken alone. Jesus has said, "Go ye therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them into the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit; teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I commanded you: and lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world" (Matthew 28:19-20).

Appreciation grows in the lives of those who have found comfort in service rendered to God. With each task fulfilled there is an assurance that mental, moral and ethical qualities are developing. "Know ye not that they that run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? Even so run; that ye may attain. And every man that striveth in the games exerciseth self-control in all things. Now they do it to receive a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible. I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, as not beating the air: but I buffet my body, and bring it into bondage: lest by any means, after that I have preached to others, I myself should be rejected" (1 Corinthians 9:24-27). Abandonment of work to be done is not within the scope of the words "Yes, Lord". Submission is the **loval watchword** to the mysteries of obedience. The expectation of the faithful is always "Yes, Lord".

Dedicated disciples choose to submit to God's authority because He is Lord of all and they are accountable for actions and deeds done in His name. God vigilantly cares for our lives and we honor Him through obedient faith. Throughout the Bible we see joy by those who serve God with a clear conscience.

The Only One Of Her Kind

Christians are an exclusive people. They belong to an **only one** of its kind fellowship and are a chosen priesthood of believers. Being fully aware of the meaning "a child of God" they have a burning desire to do good works and live lives in the choicest manner because mercy and grace has been bestowed upon them (Eph 2:1-10). These blessings are received because of faith and obedience to God's will (1 Pet 1:1, 2; Tit 3:5; Col 2:12). They do not let the world rub off on them nor do they accommodate works of darkness in their lives. They have been called out of darkness into light (Col 1:13-15; 1 Jn 1:5-10). When darkness is accommodated, Jeremiah's profound statement should rings out, "... A wonderful and horrible thing is come to pass in the land; the prophets prophesy falsely, and the priests bear rule by their means; and my people love to have it so: and what will ye do in the end thereof" (Jer 5:30-31)? To stem the tide of worldliness they live above the fray. Those who travel in the old path still sanctify the Lord in their hearts, buy the truth and sell it not and walk in the old route in order that they might find peace in their souls (1 Pet 3:15; Prov 23:23; Jer 6:16).

They grow in the grace and knowledge of their Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ (2 Pet 1:1-3). Knowledge is matured towards an end of greater participation in knowing on whom they have believed and render to Him obedience. God provided for them a knowledge which passes the world's concept of peace (Phil 4:7). Their knowledge of God is multiplied in further knowledge and it gives an inner serenity and confidence that is not affected nor hindered by outward circumstances. A personal acquaintance with Christ is esteemed and maintained having a closer more intimate fellowship with him each day.

The Christian life is the most vivid, full, rich and enjoyable one. Christians are not dependent upon material things and by faith in God they know He will supply the necessities of life (1 Tim 6:3-10). God takes pleasure in fellowship with His family and will spiritually and physically bless abundantly above all they ask or think (Eph 3:20, 21). Truly the Christian gains the real blessings offered in life. God provided this and heaven too! When Christians persist in the conduct necessary to live a godly life God recognizes and blesses them. Christians appear before man as those who are distinguished by exercising their senses to know good and evil (Heb 5:11-14). Such demeanor and appearance of the children of God is truly eye-catching and engaging. It has a drawing power so tremendously influential that it impacts others causing them to want to be like the people of God. The value of this cannot be overstated.

Taking on the divine nature provides for the child of God a way to escape the corruption which is in the world through lust (2 Pet 1: 4). Such lusts are denied access in their lives as they are consecrated to God and concentrate on the precious promises and pursuits of God's ways. God equips the saints and provides the things needful for life and godliness (2 Pet 1:1-3).

Christians are a peculiar people. Not with eccentricities and amateurish lives but they are people of renown who distinguish themselves in their pursuits of excellence. Christians seek to develop their lives being contributory as the light of the world (Matt 5:14-16; Jn 3:19-21; 12:36; 13:47; Rom 2:19; 2 Cor 6:14). [Continued left column...]
