

THE GOSPEL PLAN OF SALVATION

Hear - Romans 10:17 Believe - John 8:24 Repent - Acts 17:30 Confess - Romans 10:10 Be Baptized - Acts 22:16 Saved - in Christ (Galatians 3:27)



CALVINISM (PART ONE)



John Calvin - 1509-1564

A theological system known as *Calvinism* has influenced Christendom more than other system or man-made teachings. Sadly, this theological monstrosity has also influenced many in churches of Christ. For the next several weeks we will spend some time discussing the major principles associated with Calvinism. So, just what is Calvinism?

During the 16th century, a movement, known as *The Protestant Reformation*, began in Europe. Religious leaders began protesting and breaking away from the Roman Catholic church. Men such as Martin Luther (founder of the Lutheran church) broke away from the Roman Catholic Church, which caused others to protest and break away. One such leader was, John Calvin (the predominant founder of the Presbyterian church). Calvinism, therefore, is made of people from within Protestantism who adhere to the theological teachings of John Calvin.

However, Calvinism is really an outgrowth of *Augustinianism*, which is the philosophical and theological system of Augustine of Hippo (354-430AD). Augustine believed in "original sin," meaning babies are born sinful. That the sin of Adam and Eve is genetically passed on to all of humanity. Augustine then went on to declare that since mankind is born sinful, we cannot come to belief and knowledge of God with God working supernaturally upon the heart of sinful mankind. Therefore, Augustine taught two things that heavily influenced Calvin: (1) Original Sin and (2) Man cannot do anything to save himself. God must supernaturally act upon the heart, mind, and will of man so he can believe and understand Scripture.

Calvin developed these concepts further, which can be summarized by the acronym T.U.L.I.P:

- **T: Total Depravity** Because the guilt of Adam's sin in the Garden is inherited by everyone who has come after him, we have all inherited a sinful nature and are unable to come to God on our own.
- U: Unconditional Election Those who will be saved (the elect) have been chosen by God and individually selected for salvation without having to do anything. Calvin then taught that the Holy Spirit must directly and supernaturally open the mind of the totally deprayed, sinner.
- **L: Limited Atonement** Since salvation is "unconditional" and not all will be saved (cf. Matt.7:13-14), then Jesus' death on the cross made atonement only for the elect. i.e., Christ died for **some**, not **all**.
- **I: Irresistible Grace** Those who have been predetermined by God for salvation cannot do anything to "resist" the working of God's spirit to save him.
- **P: Perseverance of the Saints** Because the elect are saved unconditionally, they also cannot lose their salvation; instead, once they are saved, they will never fall away "Once saved, always saved."

Each of these basic tenets are contrary to the Scriptures. However, there is a logical progression to them. If one point is accepted as true, each of the next points logically follow each other. At the same time, if one of these tenets is false, then the whole system becomes false, and crumbles. As we go through this study, we will contrast the teachings of Calvinism with the gospel of Christ.
