BAPTIZED IN THE HOLY SPIRIT (Part 2) Doug Post

Last we discussed the meaning of the word, *baptized*, as it relates to the figure of speech, **baptized in the Holy Spirit**. Of course, the Greek word *baptizo* means to immerse, plunge, submerge, cover, envelope, overwhelm, and various other kindred words. It does not mean sprinkled or poured. Therefore, baptized in the Spirit carries the idea of an individual immersed, submerged, covered, and overwhelmed in the Holy Spirit. Therefore, the same ideas concerning baptized in water also apply to baptized in the Holy Spirit.

In Luke 24:49, Jesus told His apostles: "Behold, I send the Promise of My Father upon you; but tarry in the city of Jerusalem until you are endued with power from on high."¹

The English word *endued* comes from the Greek word *enduo*, meaning: *to sink into, to cover, to be clothed, to put on*. The apostles, then, were to be "**clothed**" with power from on high (from God in heaven). Now let's note some things about the above passage.

- Jesus referred to, *the Promise of My Father*.
- That Promise was to come upon the apostles.
 - The apostles had to be in Jerusalem to receive that Promise.
 - Jesus defines this Promise as being clothed or endued with power.

In Acts 1:4-5, Luke, again, records the words of Jesus: "And being assembled together with them, He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father, "which," He said, "you have heard from Me; for John truly baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

Let's note some things about the above passage:

• Jesus is addressing His apostles.

•

- He tells them to remain in Jerusalem.
- They were told to wait for the same *Promise of the Father*.
- Jesus calls this same Promise, baptized in the Holy Spirit.

Let's note some things when we compare Luke 24:49 and Acts 1:4-5:

- The same writer, Luke, recorded what Jesus said to His apostles.
- In both cases, the apostles were to remain in Jerusalem.
- The same Promise *the Promise of the Father* is referred to as both clothed with Power from on high and baptized in the Holy Spirit.
- I both parallel accounts, Jesus provides us with an answer as to what being **baptized in the Holy Spirit** means. Quite simply, it means being **clothed** with Power from on high.
- The apostles would be baptized in the Holy Spirit, which means they would receive supernatural power from God the Holy Spirit.
- They would be empowered to carry out their assignment the Lord gave them (Acts 1:8; cf. Matt. 28:19-20; Mark 16:15-16; Luke 24:47)

We will return to this very thought next week.

¹ The Greek word "ev" means "in." It may sometimes mean "among" or "with" and/or "by."
