

WHY WE DO NOT KEEP THE SABBATH (Part 3) Doug Post

The command to keep the Sabbath was not given in the book of Genesis. Yes, we read about God resting on the seventh day and that he blessed and sanctified that day, but there is no command to any human being to observe the Sabbath. Moses simply tells us what God did, not what He commanded or promised. In fact, throughout the entire book of Genesis there is no example of anyone keeping the Sabbath. It is not until the book of Exodus that we see God commanding Israel to keep the Sabbath (Ex.16:23, 20:1ff). As one reads through the entire Old Testament one will not find one Gentile ever keeping the Sabbath, or any other commandment God gave to Israel, because God gave the Law of Mo0ses only to Israel. Consider the following:

"For what great nation is there that has God so near to it, as the LORD our God is to us, for whatever reason we may call upon Him? And what great nation is there that has such statutes and righteous judgments as are in all this law which I set before you this day?" "Then you came near and stood at the foot of the mountain, and the mountain burned with fire to the midst of heaven, with darkness, cloud, and thick darkness. And the LORD spoke to you out of the midst of the fire. You heard the sound of the words, but saw no form; you only heard a voice. So He declared to you His covenant which He commanded you to perform, the Ten Commandments; and He wrote them on two tablets of stone" (Deuteronomy 4:7-13).

All Gentiles were strangers and aliens to the covenants God made with Israel, and since they were strangers to the covenants, then they were certainly strangers to the Law of Moses and, specifically, to the command to keep the Sabbath Day. Why? Were they strangers? God never gave the Gentiles any of the commandments of the Law of Moses to obey. Again, the Law of Moses, and everything pertaining to that law, was only for Israel.

We noted last week that both Jew and Gentile are now under the authority of the New Covenant (Testament). Christians are under the Law of Christ (Gal.6:2; 1 Cor.9:21), not the Law of Moses. There is no command in the New Testament for Christians to keep the Sabbath. There is no example of any Christians observing the Sabbath. Moreover, Since the Sabbath was part of the Law of Moses – the first covenant – and the 1st covenant was removed and taken away (Gal.3:19-4:31; Eph.2:14-16; Col.2:14; Rom.10:4; Heb.7:12, 8:13, 9:15-17) – then by virtue of the removal of the 1st covenant by the cross, every aspect of the Law was also removed, including the keeping of the Sabbath (Heb.10:9-10). The Sabbath was never observed by the church we read about in the New Testament.

Christians who attempt to keep even one aspect of the Law of Moses, severs themselves from Christ and falls from grace (Gal.5:1-4). Why? Because Christ shed His blood for the New Covenant (Matt. 26:28)! He did not shed His blood for the Old Testament Law. The Old Covenant law was referred to as the "ministry of death." One reason the Law was referred to as the **ministry of death** is because there were death sentences attached to each of the Ten Commandments written on stone. We will pick up here next week.
