Is Christianity a Cult?

One of the definitions offered by Webster of a cult is "a religion regarded as unorthodox or spurious." The world has at various times attempted to discredit Christianity as "just another cult." These claims are based on a misuse of scripture to say or teach things that are not accurate. Before we consider some of these claims, let us freely acknowledge that yes, there are some who take Christianity and turn it into a cult. However, the Christianity of the Bible never has been nor ever will be a cult as our culture defines a cult.

When the church was established in the first century, many early Christians were martyred by Jews intent on crushing the teachings of Jesus as well as the followers of Jesus, whom they had crucified. As the persecution intensified, Christians fled the persecution into all parts of the world. (Acts 8:1-4) At that time, Rome ruled the world. Rome even had its own "religion" which included Emperor Worship and worship of their gods. Since Christians refused to worship the Emperor or the Roman gods, there was an immediate conflict.

The Romans and Jews accused the Christians of holding "secret meetings" which excluded all who were not Christians. The accusation was that they were plotting treason against the Roman government. The Christians were simply worshipping. In worship, they partook of the Lord's Supper remembering the body and blood sacrifice of Jesus. For this, they were accused of cannibalism. Remember, when Jesus taught on this very subject, "...many of His disciples went back and walked with Him no more." (Jn. 6:66) Because the basis of Christianity was love and their own scriptures talked about "love feasts" (Jude 1:12), Christians were accused of practicing open sex and incest in their meetings. None of these accusations were true and all were distortions of teachings, beliefs, and practices of Christians.

Jesus taught His disciples, "...I have come to set a man against his father and a daughter against her mother" (Matt. 10:35) and "brother will deliver up brother to death, and a father his child; and children will rise up against parents and cause them to be put to death." (Matt. 10:21) So Christianity is accused of being a cult by trying to break up families and recruit children to oppose their parents even to the point of death. We know that was not what Jesus was teaching. The Bible is the very source for the creation of the family. (Gen. 1:28; 4:1-2)

The unique and exclusive relationship that Christians have with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit is distorted to indicate there is something "mystical" and "magical" concerning Christianity and the worship of the spiritual Godhead. For example, the washing away of sins in baptism by the blood of Jesus (Rev. 1:5) was purported as "magical happenings." The non-believer will never understand any of this.

In every case throughout history, a true understanding of Bible teaching exposes the truth. Biblical Christianity is not a cult. Christians are simply a group of people who believe in one God, salvation through His one Son, and the teachings of the Bible provided by the one Holy Spirit.

Read his email, if you have a computer, please view the four pictures of those whom we should pray for to continue their Christian life in obedience to God.

Subject: Church planted this week.

We had a successful gospel campaign in Sekou village, Margibi County this week. We went into the village on Friday and started our evangelism campaign from village to village, doing public preaching and from house to house. By the grace of God 34 persons gave their lives through baptism from Friday to Sunday and the Church was successfully planted with 82 Persons in attendance during the first worship service Sunday. Please keep the newly established Church in your prayers and the team that continue to reach out to people in towns and villages and Communities in Liberia. **Alfred**

Note from Richard: You are helping this effort in Liberia through your work and donations for Mission Printing (MP).
