

BAPTISM IN THE HOLY SPIRIT (PART 10 B) Doug Post

"But before a man can be given the indwelling of the Spirit, he must be regenerated by the Spirit so that his nature is changed. And this is clearly when a man is baptized in water. As a man's body is lowered in the water, the Holy Spirit submerges the man's spirit within himself to change his nature. And at the very precise moment when God considers that man no longer sinner but now saint, at that precise instant, the regenerating submerging Spirit moves from the outside to the inside of the heart (Tit.3:5; Gal.4:6). Less than this we cannot write, more than this we do not know."

As we continue analyzing the above quote concerning baptism in the Holy Spirit, we are told that the Spirit "submerges" the man's spirit within himself to change his nature" and then "moves from the outside to the inside of the heart." It is being argued that although a person is baptized in water, he or she remains unregenerated until the Spirit comes along and baptizes the person into Himself. The brother's fabricated and convoluted chronological argument would have the baptized individual, although purified, still unregenerated and lost, until the Spirit comes along to baptize the person into Himself.

We noted last week that Jesus is the only administrator of baptism in the Spirit (Matt.3:11), yet our brother insists the Spirit, at some point, must literally submerge (baptize) the person into Himself. While demanding an alleged chronological process he, nonetheless, attempts to provide us with a simultaneous action. However, no matter how he slices it, it still comes out as two distinct actions, because in his attempt to showcase one baptism, per Ephesians 4:5, he nonetheless, argues for two baptisms. While the person is baptized in water (baptism #1), he has the Spirit coming along to baptize the person into Himself (baptism #2).

While insisting on an alleged literal, spatial dwelling of Deity within the Christian, our brother argues for a figurative "indwelling" of Deity. You ask, how? Well, if the Spirit literally takes up a literal, spatial, residency inside the literal blood pumping organ called the heart, then the Spirit would literally be dwelling in the flesh of the Christian. After all, our brother has pinpointed the location within the Christian where this literal residency allegedly takes place. Of course, when the Bible references the "heart," it is referring to the "mind" and not the literal human organ.

If, on the other hand, our brother is arguing that the heart under consideration refers to the "mind," then he would be arguing for a figurative "heart." And, if the latter is true, and I suspect it is, then he gives up his literal residency argument, because there cannot be a literal "indwelling" in a figurative heart. One cannot have his literal cake and figuratively eat it too.

Moreover, our brother tells us the Spirit must change the person's nature before there can be an alleged literal "indwelling of Deity within the Christian. He is seemingly declaring that the person being baptized in water has an imperfect nature, even though the individual is created in the image of God. If we are created in the image of God, then there cannot be what Calvinists call "Total Hereditary Depravity" or a human "sin nature."

We will pick up here for next week's analysis.
