

# THE GOSPEL PLAN OF SALVATION

### **METONYMY (Part 3)**

(mi-ton-uh-mee)

Regarding 2 Corinthians 5:21, the Jewish New Testament, gives us this proper rendering: "God made this sinless man be a sin offering on our behalf, so that in union with him we might fully share in God's righteousness." On the same passage, Adam Clarke writes:

"In the second place, it signifies a sin-offering, or sacrifice for sin, and answers to the *chattaah* and *chattath* of the Hebrew text, which signifies both sin and sin-offering in a great variety of places in the Pentateuch. The Septuagint translates the Hebrew word by hamartia in ninety-four places in Exodus, Leviticus, and Numbers, **where a sin-offering is meant**; and where our version translates the word not sin, **but an offering for sin**. Had our translators attended to their own method of translating the word in other places where it means the same as here, they would not have given this false view of a passage which has been made the foundation of a most blasphemous doctrine; viz. that our sins were imputed to Christ, and that he was a proper object of the indignation of Divine justice, because he was blackened with imputed sin; and some have proceeded so far in this blasphemous career as to say, that Christ may be considered as the greatest of sinners, because all the sins of mankind, or of the elect, as they say, were imputed to him, and reckoned as his own."

Everything about sin-sacrifices in the Old Testament was holy to God. The animal itself had to be pure, without blemish. The place where the animal was slain had to be holy. The priest had to be holy in making the offering. Touching the flesh of the sin-offering made one holy. Peter writes: "knowing that ye were redeemed, not with corruptible things, with silver or gold, from your vain manner of life handed down from your fathers; but with precious blood, as of a lamb without spot, even the blood of Christ" (1 Pet.1:18-19). If Jesus was a blemish free, spotless, holy and righteous sacrifice, how could He be the vilest of sinners on the cross?

Hebrews 7:26-27,says: "when He offered up Himself." The "offering" of Christ was more than just His death on the cross: "For such a High Priest was fitting for us, who is holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, and has become higher than the heavens; who does not need daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifices, first for His own sins and then for the people's, for this He did once for all when He offered up Himself." Jesus was both sacrifice and High Priest. He never committed sin and He did not become sin, but He became a sin-sacrifice offered up on our behalf.

In our studies, we must always consider both the immediate and remote contexts. We also need to make a distinction between literal and figurative language. We've seen the evidence from both Testaments, that when the word **sin** is connected with Christ's in what He did, then it refers to **sin-offering** – a figure of speech known as metonymy. In the same context of our study, the apostle Paul commands us to "**be ye reconciled to God**" (2 Cor.5:20).

If *reconciliation* took place on the cross, as Calvinism avers, then why does Paul give us the responsibility of being *reconciled to God*? If Jesus did all the reconciling for us, then why command us at all? The truth is, Christ made it possible for us to *be reconciled*. The theory that He had to become the vilest of sinners in order to satisfy law and justify man is erroneous. Saying our personal sins are imputed to Christ is just as false as saying Christ's personal righteousness is imputed to us (See Ezekiel 18:19-31). And, if Christ alone makes us *righteous*, then why command us to be righteous by practicing righteousness (1 John 3:7; Acts 10:34-35)? Christ died for our sins. He did not become full of sin (sinful) for us!
