

THEY LOVED DARKNESS Doug Post

The city of Sodom was a city of wickedness and spiritual darkness, which is seen in the action of the men who lived there. The city had been given over to the practice of homosexuality because men of every age, from the best and the worst neighborhoods, surrounded Lot's house where two male visitors were lodging with him for the night (Gen. 19:4). These men lusted for these two men, wanting to lie with the carnally. However, the two "men" happened to be angels, and they took control of the matter. Moses writes, "And they struck the men who were at the doorway of the house with blindness, both small and great, so that they became weary trying to find the door" (Gen. 19:11).

Anyone who has ever experienced an eyesight problem has probably imagined what life would be like losing their eyesight, becoming physically blind. The thought is frightening. Yet, the men of Sodom cannot see but were still endeavoring to carry out their wicked intention. As they learned that all of them had immediately become blind, I wonder if it ever occurred to them to ask, "Who has the power to cause all of us to lose our sight?" What could cause such dedication that all these facts were overlooked?

Jesus explained it some 2,000 years later: "And this is the condemnation, that the light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil" (John 3:19). The men of Sodom did not just flirt with evil; they loved it. They cared about their wicked practices more than anything else—even their eyesight. They were so full of lust in their perverted quest to have the two men, they did not seem to mind being in either spiritual or physical darkness, because they "they loved the darkness rather than the light."

They also did not hesitate to be disloyal to Lot. When he tried to talk them out of their perverted intention—even calling it wicked—they snapped back that they would now deal worse with him than the others (Gen. 19:9). Had they forgotten that it was Lot's uncle, Abram (Abraham), who had rescued Sodom and the other four cities of the plain (Gen. 14:14-16)?

Because Chedorlaomer and his three confederate kings had captured Lot, Abram pursued them, defeated them, and set them free. The inhabitants of Sodom owed Abram a debt, but because of their perverse intentions they quickly forgot all about that. In fact, they excoriated Lot for trying to exercise a righteous influence over them. What Jesus taught later explains their behavior: "For everyone practicing evil hates the light, and does not come to the light, lest his deed should be exposed" (John 3:20). May we, as God's people, never choose darkness!
