

Calvinism (Part Three)

The concept of *Total Hereditary Depravity* as it relates to the faulty theological system known as Calvinism, teaches mankind is born in sin, that every baby is born a "little devil," having inherited sin from Adam. And, since every human being is born "**dead in sin**" (Eph.2:1-3), there is nothing we can do to effect righteousness, i.e., we cannot do right nor can we even respond to the gospel, unless, and until, God directly and supernaturally manipulates the mind, supernaturally infusing them with faith and the ability to respond to the gospel message. *Total Hereditary Depravity* is assumed because it results from the false premise that humanity is born in sin, born sinful human beings. We refer to this as "circular reasoning" and if the premise is false, so is the conclusion. Therefore, we must ask the question, "Just who or what is born sinful?" We are made in the "**image**" and "**likeness**" of God (Gen.1:26-27; 9:6; 1 Cor.11:7; James 3:9; Acts 17:29).

Folks, the part of man that is made in the image and likeness of God is our spirit – the human spirit. While there is a distinction between spirit and soul (Heb.4:12), they are sometimes used interchangeably. Paul describes the human spirit as the inward man (2 Cor. 4:16; Rom.7:22; cf. Prov.20:7). In fact, the Holy Spirit specifically says: "Then shall the dust return to the earth as it was: and the spirit shall return unto God who gave it" (Eccl.12:7). What we must understand is that the human spirit comes from God. God is pure and holy. He is light, and in Him there is no darkness at all (John 1: and returns to God. The obvious point here is that God does not create or fashion sin, nor does He create, or fashion anything sinful, including the human spirit. God and sin are polar, opposites. God and sin cannot even be mentioned in the same breath. Nothing sinful can come from God, including the spirit which He gives to human beings.

All human beings are born upright and then go astray, which is the point the prophet Isaiah makes in declaring, "All we like sheep have gone astray" (Isa.53:6). Please note Isaiah does not say mankind is *born astray*, he says we *go astray*, and there is a vast difference between those two thoughts. David says, "The wicked are estranged from the womb: they go astray as soon as they be born, speaking lies" (Psa.58:3). Again, it is said we "go astray," it does not say we are *born astray*.

Some argue that the text says we go astray as soon as we are born. Yes, however, David is using a figure of speech called *hyperbole*. He is not suggesting babies, literally, begin sinning as soon as they are born any more than they, literally, begin speaking lies the moment they are born. Rather, he is simply saying we go astray at a relatively young age. However, if humanity is BORN astray, then where do they go when the GO astray? Do they go more astray from being astray?

Scripture does not teach mankind is born in sin. He does not have a sinful nature and, therefore, man cannot help but sin. On the contrary, it teaches we sin despite a good nature: "Lo, this only have I found, that God hath made man <u>upright</u>; but they have sought out many inventions" (Ecclesiastes 7:29). In other words, they "go astray." The Prophet Ezekiel stresses the fact that sin is not inherited by saying, "The soul who sins shall die. The son shall not bear the guilt of the father, nor the father bear the guilt of the son. The righteousness of the righteous shall be upon himself, and the wickedness of the wicked shall be upon himself" (Ezk.18:20). The Truth is babies do not inherit sin from Adam. "For the children being not yet born, neither having done any good or evil..." (Romans 9:11). Elsewhere we are told that "little ones" and "children" have no "knowledge of good and evil" (Deut.1:39). Isaiah 7:16 speaks of a child coming to an age when he knows to "refuse the evil and choose the good." Please consider these thoughts and we will pick up here next week. Doug Post

(Jer. 15:1,4)

Surely at the commandment of the LORD this came upon Judah, to remove them from His sight because of the sins of Manasseh, according to all that he had done, and also because of the innocent blood that he had shed; for he had filled Jerusalem with innocent blood, which the LORD would not pardon. (2 Kings 24:3-4)
