

"Giving" or "Taking" Doug Post

Many feel that happiness comes from what they get, but the truth is, happiness comes from giving ourselves. There is no lasting joy by thinking joy comes from receiving from others. In fact, most dissatisfaction and unhappiness are the result of worldly thinking.

The ruler of this world (Satan) has done a great job in convincing us that the filling of one's own desires is superior to filling the needs of others. This worldly mindset is always one of self-centeredness. No wonder there are so many unhappy souls.

We are either a *producer* or a *consumer*. We may be characterized by **doing** productive things for others, or we may be characterized by the **consuming** of that which others do for us. As someone has put it: "There are basically two kinds of people in the world — hosts and guests."

Which trait is the predominant one in our lives? Are we mostly givers, who find our happiness in the service we render to others? Or are we mainly takers, who can even find fault with the quality of what is given to us?

Jesus taught, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Ac. 20:35). That doesn't mean that giving is more pleasing to God; it means that the giver himself is more "blessed" — in other words, he is more fortunate, more joyous (cf. Prov. 11:24–26). Although it sounds contradictory, the giver gets more of the good things in life than the taker.

We are made in the image of God, and it is inherent in God's own nature that He finds joy in the giving of Himself. He is outwardly oriented toward the needs of His creatures, and not primarily concerned about Himself. Like Him, we find our true fulfillment and happiness in being givers rather than takers.

This week, through meditation and prayer, may we learn that true happiness comes from giving ourselves through serving others. That is the sacrifice we give to God as well.

Most of us in this country are truly blessed to have God's Word readily available to us. Yet, all too often folks today still search for something else – something man has written -- leading those very individuals to drift away from God's truths

We must follow and teach the Gospel as it is written. Revelations 22:18-19 tells us, "For I testify to everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of this book: If anyone adds to these things, God will add to him the plagues that are written in this book; and if anyone takes away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part from the Book of Life, from the holy city, and *from* the things which are written in this book."

The ultimate author of every word in the Bible is the Holy Spirit. The setting forth of the will of God in both the Old and New Testaments was accomplished as "men spake from God, being moved by the Holy Spirit." (II Peter 1:21). It is our responsibility to acknowledge the Authority of this Book of writings, and to receive it "not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God, which also worketh in you that believe." (I Thess. 2:13). This inspired, complete, and authoritative revelation of truth was delivered to us through men who were so controlled by the Spirit of God that they could not destroy or mar the message being given through them. Their very words were chosen by the Holy Spirit and not by themselves. (I Cor. 2:12-16).

The Bible is the all-sufficient Word of God. The Psalmist said, "Forever, O LORD, Your word is settled in heaven" (Ps. 119:89). Isaiah wrote, "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God stands forever" (Isa. 40:8). Jesus said, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will by no means pass away" (Matt. 24:35). "...the word of the LORD endures forever" (I Pet. 1:25). God "has given to us all things that *pertain* to life and godliness,..." (2 Peter 1:3). Therefore, we are not to add to or take from God's Word. Let's devote ourselves to reading, studying, and meditating on God's Word daily.
