

"Know Thyself" Doug Post

Shakespear provided us with a philosophical maxim that says, "To thine own self be true." One can hardly be true to self without, first, knowing self. There is an inscription found in the temple of Apollo that says, "Know thyself." Although sage advice, it is William more difficult than we think because we often have trouble seeing ourselves as we really are. As difficult as it may be, we still must have the responsibility of seeing ourselves honestly and truthfully. Being honest with ourselves is a godly trait we must always exhibit.

The gospel of Christ requires, among other things, that we repent of our sins. But we will not repent of sin until we have enough honesty to admit the sins we have committed. For this reason, repentance requires an honest self-examination. We have to have the courage to face the facts and try to see our actions as they appear to God. The apostle Paul wrote: "Examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Do you not know yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you?—unless indeed you are disqualified" (2 Corinthians 13:5).

We must not only love the truth in a general way but be willing to deal specifically with the truth about ourselves. If we run away from the truth about ourselves because it is unpleasant, then we miss the opportunity to correct our faults. And if we aren't willing to correct ourselves, then those faults will be our destruction. When we examine ourselves with *the faith* – the word of God – we are truly seeing how God is sees us because we see we have fallen short of His spiritual expectations.

So how honest are we about ourselves? The following are some questions that can test our self-honesty. Do we pray for help in seeing ourselves as God sees us? Do we pray for friends who love our souls more than they love our friendship, friends who will not let us excuse or ignore our sins? Do we pray to see ourselves as we really are? Do we pray for our secrets to be exposed, if that's what it takes to make us deal with our sins? Do we pray for godly character? Do we pray to always accept truth?

Honesty takes humility but if we're not willing to be humble, we cannot grow. If we won't admit where we are right now, then we'll never advance beyond our present state. Growth may be uncomfortable, but it's the healthiest thing in the world. So may we commit ourselves to an honesty that will accept the truth, whatever it is — even the truth that requires some change on our part.
