

The Bible and the Law of Rationality Doug Post

There are a lot of religious folks who have an unwarranted fear of logic. They fear it in part because it is so often misused by others to attack the existence of God, the inspiration of the Scriptures, and the Deity of Jesus Christ. People professing faith in God are often portrayed as superstitious folk and sometimes even as mentally unstable or deficient.

However, the Christian faith has nothing really to fear from logic properly understood and used. In fact, the Bible is without doubt the most logical book ever written. It is inspired by the Holy Spirit and is thus drawn from the mind of the living God who created man as a moral and logical being (1 Corinthians 2:8-13; Genesis 1:1ff.).

God is then the Creator also of logic. He Himself is quite logical. As a result, there are four basic laws of thought that God designed for the functioning of the human mind in drawing conclusions in logic. One of these is the *Law of Rationality*. It holds simply that we ought to justify our conclusions by **adequate evidence**. In other words, the evidence ought to determine the claims we make on any given doctrine.

That the Bible recognizes this principle of logic, which itself simply refers to *the principles of valid reasoning*, is seen in some Biblical passages. One text is 1 Peter 3:15, which commands us to "**be ready always to give an answer unto every man for the hope that lies within us, with meekness and fear**." The word "**answer**" is from the Greek noun *apologia*, from where we get our terms *apologetics* and *apology*. The latter term has evolved from its original meaning. Today, the word "apology," means, "I'm sorry" or "I apologize." However, the word *apologia* originally meant to offer a defense or reason for one's actions or beliefs, which is still the force of the term *apologetics*.

Another text is 1 Thessalonians 5:21-22, which reads: "**Prove all things; hold fast to that which is good; abstain from every appearance of evil**." Christians are charged with having to **prove all things**. Therefore, we must be concerned about the evidence for what we believe, teach, and practice. The word "**prove**" is from a Greek word meaning *to show the genuineness of a thing*, from which we get the word, *document*. It is quite reasonable, then, that we should be concerned about Truth (Proverbs 23:23), which also requires us to be concerned with *evidence*.

God has never expected us to check our brains at the door, but always reason properly from the Scriptures (Isaiah 1:18; Acts 17:1-2; 19:8).
