

THE GOSPEL PLAN OF SALVATION

Hear - Romans 10:17 Believe - John 8:24 Repent - Acts 17:30 Confess - Romans 10:10 Be Baptized - Acts 22:16 Saved - in Christ (Galatians 3:27)



What is the gift of the Holy Spirit in Acts 2:38-39? (Part 3) Doug Post

"Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is to you and to your children, and to all who are afar off, as many as the Lord our God will call" (Acts 2:38-39).

Some believe the *gift of the Holy Spirit* is the indwelling of Deity (Holy Spirit). That Deity is (allegedly) given to each baptized person so He can literally reside inside their bodies – within human flesh. But does Acts 2:38-39 even teach such a thing? We know the words "indwells", or "dwells", and "literally" are not found in the text. We know those gathered on Pentecost were repent and be baptized and they were to "receive" something, which was said to be the *gift of the Holy Spirit*. Nothing within the context of Acts 2:38-39 demands this to be a literal "indwelling" of Deity within the bodies of Christians. We have already noted that all scholars say the phrase *gift of the Holy Spirit* can mean that the gift is the Holy Spirit, or it can mean something the Holy Spirit gives, in other words, the *Holy Spirit's gift*.

Moreover, must the words, "in", "within", and "dwells in" always be understood literally? Of course not! But, Doug, don't you know the Bible means what it says? When it says "in" it means "in", and when it says "dwells in" it means just that. C'mon, Doug, it's so easy. Paul said he had the church of Philippi in his heart, but it did not mean they were literally inside his body (Phil.1:7). Satan was said to be dwelling in the church of Pergamos, where his throne was (Rev.2:12-13). Was Satan literally sitting on his throne in the church of Pergamos? To ask is but to answer. Moreover, the Bible tells us God dwelt in both the tabernacle and temple, but it never meant He was literally inside them. Therefore, He was dwelling in these places in some manner, but not literally (Acts 7:46-48). In fact, God cannot literally dwell on the earth, neither can He be literally contained (1 Kings 8:27). We are told God dwells in us, but we are also told we dwell in God (1 John 3:24; 4:12-16).

I'm not the smartest knife in the drawer, but I know I cannot literally be inside God – a Spirit Being – who is in heaven. I'm not literally in heaven and literally on earth at the same time, am I? I also know literal human flesh and blood cannot enter heaven (1 Cor.15:50). Therefore, there I must see the phrase "dwells in" in a different light, taking it figuratively. We are told God <u>dwells</u> in His people and that He <u>walks</u> in them (2 Cor.6:16). Brethren, God is no more literally walking inside your body than He is literally residing spatially inside your flesh. Interestingly, Paul quotes several Old Testament passages concerning God dwelling in the tabernacle, yet we know, for a fact, God did not literally dwell there, because the Spirit tells us.

Regarding 2 Cor.6:16, Paul wrote: "I will dwell in (ev) them and walk among (ev) them." The word ev ("in") can mean "among." Note how most Bible versions translate the first ev as "in", because they believe God literally resides in their bodies, but then translate the second ev as "among" because it says God would "walk" ev them. They recognized the absurdity of such a thought, so they translated the second ev as "among" rather than "in". There is much inconsistency among Bible versions when it comes to translating ev as either "in" or "among." When they see "dwell ev them" they automatically assume it means God is LITERALLY inside them, but when they see "walk ev them" they recognize the absurdity and translate it as "among". However, in both cases the word ev could just as easily be translated "among". We will pick up here next week.

BE A DONKEY!

"Woe to them! For they have gone the way of Cain, and for pay they have rushed headlong into the error of Balaam, and perished in the rebellion of Korah." Jude 11

"My brethren, if any among you strays from the truth and one turns him back, let him know that ^[a]he who turns a sinner from the error of his way will save his soul from death and will cover a multitude of sins." James 5:19-20

Balaam, desirous of gold, silver and prestige, jumped at the chance to go with Balak's emissaries. He knew God said Israel was blessed and not to be cursed, for God had told him.
