

METONYMY (Part 1)

(mi-ton-uh-mee)

There is a figure of speech known as *metonymy* whereby we associate the qualities of one word or phrase with another word or phrase. For instance, we do this when associate the phrase "**breaking of the bread**" or the word "**communion**" to describe the *Lord's Supper*. We also refer to the *fruit of the vine* as the "**cup**." We use one name, word, or phrase, to associate, define, or describe another name, word, or phrase.

The word **metonymy** comes from the Greek word <u>μετωνυμία</u> (metōnumía), which is comprised of two Greek words: **meta**, meaning *change*, and **anoma**, meaning *name*. Hence, **a change in name**. For instance, the word "**circumcision**" was used to describe the Jews (Judaizers) as the *circumcision* and the Gentiles as the *uncircumcision* (Eph.2:11).

We sometimes put the cause for the effect (*metonymy of the cause*). Luke says the Jews preached and read Moses every Sabbath (Acts 15: 21). Instead of saying the Law of Moses, it is said the Jews preached and read Moses. Moses (the cause) is used in place of the Law of Moses (the effect). Moreover, Paul said "Moses is read" (2 Cor.3:15), meaning the Law of Moses was being read.

Regarding Christ's sacrifice, Paul wrote, "For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him" (2 Cor. 5:21). This text is often taken out of context, creating the unfortunate and unwarranted idea that Christ literally became sin. Referring to Christ, Martin Luther said: "And this, no doubt all the prophets did foresee in spirit,—that Christ should become the greatest transgressor, murderer, adulterer, thief, rebel, blasphemer, that ever was or could be in the world. For he, being made a sacrifice for the sins of the whole world, is not now an innocent person and without sins." Another writer referred to Jesus, "As the one great Sinner—the one who had become sin, the one who was accursed beyond all that ever lived ..."

Is this really the meaning of the text? Did Jesus <u>LITERALLY</u> become sin? Well, if Christ literally became sin, then He would have been full of sin – "sinful." But such is an absurdity because He was sinlessly perfect. He was the **unspotted** Lamb of God. In fact, Paul makes this point very clear in the very same verse saying Jesus "knew no sin."

Any superficial reading of a word or phrase can be dangerous. Words and phrases can easily mean different things in different contexts. The focus here is on the meaning of "sin." Does it really mean Jesus became the biggest sinner in the history of the world? No! It's a grave mistake to ignore the figure of *metonymy*, because in this very context, Paul uses "sin" in place of "sin offering."

In fact, in the book of Leviticus the word for "sin" is translated as "sin-offering" over 50 times because that is what it means. For instance— "Speak unto Aaron and to his sons, saying, this is the law of sin offering: In the place where the burnt offering is killed shall the sin offering be killed before the Lord: it is most holy" (Lev.6:25). We will return to further explain 1 Cor.5:21 in light of metonymy.
