

THE GOSPEL PLAN OF SALVATION

Hear - Romans 10:17 Believe - John 8:24 Repent - Acts 17:30 Confess - Romans 10:10 Be Baptized - Acts 22:16 Saved - in Christ (Galatians 3:27)



BAPTISM IN THE HOLY SPIRIT (PART 10 C) Doug Post

For the past two weeks we've been considering the following quote:

But before a man can be given the indwelling of the Spirit, he must be regenerated by the Spirit so that his nature is changed. And this is clearly when a man is baptized in water. As a man's body is lowered in the water, the Holy Spirit submerges the man's spirit within himself to change his nature. And at the very precise moment when God considers that man no longer sinner but now saint, at that precise instant, the regenerating submerging Spirit moves from the outside to the inside of the heart (Tit.3:5; Gal.4:6). Less than this we cannot write, more than this we do not know.\frac{1}{2}

We previously mentioned how the phrase "washing of regeneration" in Titus 3:5, is a possessive genitive and may be rendered, "regeneration's washing." For instance, the phrase "church of Christ" means "Christ's church." The phrase "word of God" means, "God's word," or the "Day of the Lord" simply means the Lord's Day. Likewise, "washing of regeneration" means "regeneration's washing." Therefore, the apostle Paul says, "but according to His mercy He saved us through (by) regeneration's washing." Quite simply, the phrase refutes the dichotomy found in the above quote because the grammatical construction has washing and regeneration taking place simultaneously, the meaning of which is "the washing produced by regeneration," or even "the washing which is regeneration."

The author's attempt at forcing *baptism in the Holy Spirit* into the plan of salvation is the result of twisting the Scriptures (2 Peter 3:16). No Scripture, including Titus 3:5 remotely intimates some alleged two-step process whereby STEP 1 is washing (baptism), which makes way for STEP 2 *baptism in the Holy Spirit*, so Deity can dwell (take up spatial real estate) within the Christian. The absurd implication is that when folks have been cleansed/washed by being baptized in water, they are somehow, still spiritually dead in their sins, so much so the Spirit must come along and clean up baptism's incompleteness. and revive and regenerate them. In other words, being cleansed, washed, or purified, does not mean cleansed, washed, and purified. Baptism in water falls short of its design, therefore, the Holy Spirit must step in and manipulate the human spirit, supernaturally and directly, so the human spirit can come alive. This is sheer sophistry.

We must also note that this brother says the person who is baptized in water *must be regenerated by* the Spirit so that his nature is changed. Therefore, even though a person is baptized for the remission of sins (Acts 2:38) he or she is still not fully cleansed, remaining dead in his or her sins until such time he or she is made alive by an alleged direct working of the Spirit. Although baptized in water, the person has not yet been fully cleansed, is not a Christian, and has not been added to the church or kingdom (Acts 2:47), because the person's nature has yet to be changed. But this is precisely what Calvinism teaches. That human beings are born with a sin nature, and even though our human spirit comes directly from God (Eccl.12:7), we somehow are born with a sin nature.

Lastly, unlike water baptism, where folks arise from the waters, we are told that those baptized in the Holy Spirit do not arise from the Spirit: Our brother writes, *If the Spirit were the element specifically being referenced, then we have the difficulty of explaining how we are baptized in the Spirit and then that we come out of the Spirit. If we were to come out of the Spirit, we would lose the benefit or the effect of that element.*² The clear implication here is that of once saved by the Spirit, always saved by Spirit. Brethren, if a person is allegedly in the Person of the Spirit (Deity), who is also allegedly, and literally inside the person, then there can be no sin at all, because there cannot be sin in the Person of the Holy Spirit. What a mess! Remember, any doctrine that implies another false doctrine, is itself a false doctrine. We will return to this spot next week.
