

# **METONYMY (Part 2)**

(mi-ton-uh-mee)

Last week we began discussing the figure of speech known as Metonymy. One primary example we used was 2 Corinthians 5:21: "For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him."

Our focus is on the use of "sin." Does this text teach Jesus became the greatest sinner in the history of the world? No, it does not. Here we note that the figure used is metonymy of the cause. The cause of the death of Christ was human sin, and the remedy for our sin was the offering of Christ on the cross of calvary. Therefore, "sin" stands for "sin-offering," which Jesus was. In the book of Hosea, the wicked priests were eating the sin-offerings of the people. Hosea then says that the priests were eating the "sin of My people" (Hos.4:8; cf. Ex.29:14; Heb.9:28). They were not eating the "sin" of the people, but the "sin-offerings" of the people. This is the very point of 2 Cor.5:21 – the word "sin" is used to mean sin-offering.

We noted previously that in the book of Leviticus, the word "sin" is translated as "sin-offering" fifty times. For instance— "Speak unto Aaron and to his sons, saying, This is the law of sin offering: In the place where the burnt offering is killed shall the sin offering be killed before the Lord: it is most holy" (Lev. 6:25). Note that the phrase "sin-offering" is found twice in this passage, but it is not found in the original text. Only the word "sin" is found. The word "offering" is not in the Hebrew text at all. This is also true concerning trespass and trespass-offering (asham in Hebrew). In Isaiah 53:10, it is said "when thou shalt make his soul an offering for sin." The phrase, "offering for sin," is from the single word, asham – the word for "trespass," which is accurately translated as "trespass-offering," or "offering for sin."

In the Septuagint, the Greek translation of the Old Testament, the phrase, "sin offering," from the Hebrew word for sin, is translated by the Greek word, hamartia, meaning sin. This is exactly what we find in 2 Corinthians 5:21. Hebrews 10:6 says God was not pleased with the "whole burnt offerings and sacrifices for sin," which is a quote from Psalm 40:6. The word "sacrifices" was added to the word, "sin" (hamartia), just as in 2 Cor.5:21. Therefore, we have New Testament commentary on how the word is to be understood.

Romans 8:2-3 says— "For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus made me free from the law of sin and of death. For what the law could not do, in that it was weak through the flesh, God, sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, condemned sin in the flesh." The phrase "and for sin," means sinsacrifice, which is demonstrated by the footnote in the American Standard Version: "and as an offering for sin,' Lev. 7:37 &c. Heb. 10:6 &c.14."

With reference to the sacrifice of Christ, the word "sin" stands for "sin sacrifice" which is rooted in the Old Testament as noted in Leviticus. Notice also that in Hebrews 10:14, the word *prosphera*, meaning "offering." This word is the same as "sin offering" from the word for "sin." So, hamartia ("sin") and prosphera ("offering"), are synonyms in that context. We might also note that the UBS New Testament Greek Dictionary, #271, tells us that word hamartia ("sin") is "often sin offering."
