

THE GOSPEL PLAN OF SALVATION

GIVE GOD THE GLORY ALL THE TIME Doug Post

The choices we make, the things we say and do, and even our thoughts determine if we glorify God or not. Are we helping His cause or hurting it?

We are either friends with God or we are not. There is no in-between with God: "Adulterers and adulteresses! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Whoever therefore wants to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God" (James 4:4). Therefore, we need to strive to be a people desirous of honoring God in everything we think, say, and do.

If it is our desire to be Christ-like, then we must strive to give God the honor due Him. After all, this is the purpose for which we were created. We were created by God to bring Him glory (Isa. 43:7). When our actions show forth God's goodness and His glory, we are fulfilling our destiny as His creatures. As God's vessels we ought to have a great desire to always please Him. Paul writes:

But in accordance with your hardness and your impenitent heart you are treasuring up for yourself wrath in the day of wrath and revelation of the righteous judgment of God, who will render to each one according to his deeds": eternal life to those who by patient continuance in doing good seek for glory, honor, and immortality; but to those who are self-seeking and do not obey the truth, but obey unrighteousness—indignation and wrath, tribulation and anguish, on every soul of man who does evil, of the Jew first and also of the Greek; but glory, honor, and peace to everyone who works what is good, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For there is no partiality with God (Romans 2:5-11).

Doing all to glorify God (and seeking to avoid anything inconsistent with His glory), we discover a meaning to life that would otherwise be impossible. Even the difficult and painful necessities of life take on a different look when we see them as opportunities to glorify God. Paul even went so far as to say that if Christ would be honored by his death, then he was ready to die: "It is my eager expectation and hope that I will not be at all ashamed, but that with full courage now as always Christ will be honored in my body, whether by life or by death" (Phil. 1:20). Paul's attitude is commendable, and we ought to strive for the same mindset.

We are to honor God not just on Sundays, but every day. Our aim is to faithfully serve Him with intentionality. We may never give our lives as martyrs, but we can sacrifice for Him every day. Paul writes, "I beseech you, therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living a sacrifice, wholly acceptable (pleasing) to the Lord, which is your reasonable service" (Romans 12:1-2). Note also, "For you were once in darkness but now light in the Lord. Walk as children of light (for the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness, righteousness, and truth), finding out what is acceptable (pleasing) to the Lord" (Eph.5:8-10).

Since we are always in God's presence and He knows what we think, say, and do, then let us "make it our aim, whether present or absent, to be well pleasing to Him" (2 Cor. 5:9). Paul put it this way: "Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men" (Col. 3:23). And Jesus said, "Let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven" (Mt. 5:16).
