

RUN TO WIN Doug Post

Paul used the analogy of an athlete competing in the games to describe our lives as Christians. Whether someone competes athletically or not, anyone would be familiar with the concept.

Paul wrote, "Run in such a way that you may win" (1 Corinthians 9:24). This means we are to take the endeavor seriously. No athlete with a lax attitude toward a competition will succeed. In the same way, we cannot afford to have that kind of careless attitude in our service to God. It is very important.

He them emphasized the need to exercise "self-control in all things" (1 Corinthians 9:25). Paul said of himself, "But I discipline my body and make it my slave, so that, after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified" (1 Corinthians 9:27). The "race" in which Christians are running is not a sprint but a marathon. Quitting before the end will not result in victory.

We need to recognize our lives as Christians as a race. We must be diligent in our training, determined in our effort, and then persevere until the end. If we do, we can win that "**imperishable**" wreath (1 Corinthians 9:25). Therefore, run so as to win. Don't think of this as a casual, inconsequential event. Recognize the importance of this race and do everything you can to finish the course.

We are to run as if we are in a literal marathon race, which means we must instill a competitive mindset. However, we are not competing against each other, but **with** each other, and we are competing against our common enemy – Satan.

It would be terribly wrong to think that mere participation will win you the prize. Rather, we are to run the race, having the proper mindset that will get us the prize – eternal life.
