

All of us have some good and bad things we can remember. Some experience much *unpleasantness* in life and have a bitter view of life. Others may experience much *pleasantness* in life and are unable to identify with the problems others have faced. However, for most of us, our lives end up being about equal: we experience both *sunshine* and *rain*.

However, having the proper perspective regarding both good and bad experiences is paramount in living our lives. We need to firmly believe that with God in our lives, our future will be better than our past. Neither our pleasant memories nor our painful ones should hold us back from the future that God wants us to have.

The apostle Paul was no doubt thankful for the many blessings he enjoyed in his younger years. Still, when he thought about his life prior to becoming a Christian, the thing that seems to have stood out most in his memory was the fact that he had actively persecuted the Lord's church. He said, "For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God" (1 Cor. 15:9).

Yet having obeyed the gospel, he had the right attitude: "But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me" (1 Cor. 15:10). Paul was a man who thought humbly about the past and thought courageously about the future.

We must learn from the problems we've experienced, so that they help (rather than hinder) our future progress; and we need to be grateful for the good things that have come our way, without becoming complacent about them. The future will not be what it should be if we fall prey to discouragement about our defeats or to pride about our privileges.

Whatever may have occurred in our lives, Jesus wants us to press ahead to the better tomorrow that He has in store for us. Let's begin working for that tomorrow now – today! Having the proper perspective regarding life's experiences will ultimately help us to become more faithful.
